

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the docesan website. PASTOR'S PEN


Each year, the Sunday after Christmas, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, consisting of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. The message is clear: Family has a special place in the life of the church. Family is considered the "miniature Church." The Holy Family isn't an image of only three persons, "it's a miniature of the whole Church on mission to the world." Consistently, Church brings all to a richer realization of the significance of Family in the life of every person. Family is the basic unit of human society. Civilizations flourish when families are strong. Family life may vary from Cultures to traditions, yet the Church defends and promotes marriage and family life. It has fought for the rights of family and its place in civil society. In its 2000 years of history, the Church has consistently taught and fostered the primacy of marriage and family life. Through this feast, the Church invites us to draw inspiration from the Holy family of Nazareth to live family life better in today's world.

Children are gifts to a family. Yet for a wide variety of reasons, many couples are unable to conceive. Many such couples adopt children and give an environment of a home to them. I have seen the joy of couples with no success for many years to conceive a child, who finally conceives a child. Imagine the prayers they might have said for that child, and they too can easily borrow the lines from the First Samuel: "I prayed for this child, and the Lord granted my request" (1 Sam 1:27). For some couples, such blessings came especially after having adopted another child. What a blessing it is to see such beautiful moments in the life of a family!

On the other hand, we see the stark reality of abortion which takes away the breath of life from thousands of children, across the world. I sympathize with couples who are forced by circumstances to make such terrible choices regarding the life of the unborn! Human families fall prey to poverty or extreme selfishness. We do know families that struggle with the pain and guilt of such choices. Much healing is needed in our families today. It is abundantly known that the absence of one of the parents— father or mother— often leaves lifelong psychological scars on children. There's some form of brokenness in everyone's life and healing is needed for everyone. Let us keep praying for healing and comfort at this season of Christmas when families gather to celebrate together.

The Feast of the Holy Family inspires our families to become holy. Holiness is not about perfection. It takes a great deal of trust and prayer to be a holy family. That's where we can draw inspiration from the Holy Family of Nazareth. Their humility, total submission to God's plan, and the abiding trust in God's care invite us to look at life in our own families. Holiness begins in knowing that God has set us apart for a purpose, in the midst of a community. In the chaos and imperfection of family life, we have an opportunity to learn about our gifts and talents, our temperaments and what our callings may be and how to respond to needs in our world. Each day, families need to consciously welcome God into their families. Parents have a great role to play in this and every mother and father can draw inspiration from the examples of Mary and Joseph. In many ways, this feast is a celebration of all families. Happy feast to all families of the Parish!
