

WIAWSO Diocesan Clean Water Appeal

WIAWSO Diocese is part of The Catholic World of believers in West Africa, Ghana, created by the Late Saint John Paul II, in December 1999. As a known fact, 783 million children and adults face a life-threatening crisis globally for lack of clean water. Disease spreads rapidly under these conditions, which only adds to the misery, suffering and the pain. The quest for safe and clean water requires much effort to come to the aid of our brothers and sisters. Seeking relief of scooping a couple of handfuls from untreated nearby rivers and streams add to the problem. It is a dangerous life situation for the women and their families as the quantity and quality of water is never enough to keep them from dehydration and bad health. We all know... WATER IS LIFE! They try to plant and live on their own food but how to get them cooked poses the problem. Hence, the bishop is working with global organizations to sinking wells with hand-pumps for service, building reservoirs to store rainfall water to be collected during the rainy season and constructing water pipes, if possible, to where water is needed.

The Bishop needs your help! The goal is to fund 5 wells with hand-pumps, each roughly at three thousand dollars (\$3000.00). Covid has hit hard and the economy is not strong... so please join together and help those who are in desperate need of this natural resource.

PASTOR'S PEN

Our travel from EauClaire to Lake Dallas went well. I am here in Texas for my spiritual retreat. With the heat of Texas, the retreat might turn out to be a "desert" experience! We reached the Retreat Center on Monday evening. We thank God for the safe travel through several States. Before we start the retreat this evening, I thought of sending the *Pastor's Pen.* So, here it comes with a warm hug all the way from the Texan plains.

Did you know that spiritual retreats are an integral part of many religious traditions? In Christianity, a spiritual retreat can be defined as a definite time (from few hours in length to a month), spent away from one's normal life for the purpose of reconnecting, usually in prayer, with God. The fasting of Jesus in the desert for forty days is used as a biblical justification of retreats.

The meaning of "retreat" can be different for different religious communities. In Hinduism and Buddhism, meditative retreats are seen by some as an intimate way of deepening powers of concentration and insight. In the business world, modern organizations conduct corporate retreats on a regular basis to consider their strategic direction, review progress and set up goals and objectives for the year.

The practice of leaving one's everyday life to connect on a deeper level with God is as old as Christianity itself. However, the practice of spending a specific time away with God is a more modern phenomenon, dating from 1520s, particularly with the Spiritual Exercises of St Ignatius. The Spiritual Exercises were intended for people wanting to live closer to God's will for their life. In the 17th century, retreats became much more widespread in the Catholic Church. Retreats for married people and youth groups are popular in these days. Retreats are very helpful for anyone who desires to foster intimacy with God and persons. I would strongly recommend that married couples take time for marriage retreats. Most marriage retreats are organized during the weekends. If couples can find time to go for vacation, it is possible that they can also find time for a weekend retreat each year, which will enhance their marriage and family life.

On August 15th, we celebrate the feast of the Assumption of Mary. The Assumption of Mary is one of the four Marian dogmas of the Catholic Church. Pope Pius XII defined this belief in his 1950 apostolic constitution *Munificentissimus Deus* as follows: "We proclaim and define it to be a dogma revealed by God that the immaculate Mother of God, Mary ever virgin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven." The Pope did not invent this teaching but confirmed the belief of Christians. Several theologians, including Martin Luther, have preached and taught this belief. So, the Assumption of Mary is not a Catholic dogma *per se*. We will have a special devotional rosary and Holy Mass on August 15th. All those who can, please join. Talk to the family members and get the children excited about it. Bring them for Mass and take them out for breakfast!

Next weekend, we will have a visiting priest to celebrate the weekend Masses and speak about the evangelization work in Africa. Let us be generous to support the works of the Church in other countries. You will find envelopes for the donations. As part of the Mission Coop program of the diocese, I will be gone to another Parish in the diocese that weekend for Mission appeal.

During the retreat days, I shall keep you in my prayers...
