THE FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD, “CANDLEMAS”

Next Weekend—February 1st and 2nd

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is next weekend! We will be doing the lighting and blessing of candles at all the weekend Masses of February 1st and 2nd. **All are encouraged to bring candles for the Masses that weekend!**

You may purchase candles that we have available, OR you may bring unscented candles from home. Candles will be available for purchase before and after all weekend Masses this weekend, January 25th & 26th, and February 1st and 2nd. It is \$2 per candle.

For the procession at the 5:00pm Saturday Mass and 8:30am Sunday Mass, we will be doing the Second Form: “The Solemn Entrance” (see Breaking Bread Missalette page 66). All people should be seated in their pews, and altar servers will come around to light candles where you are seated. The Priest will bless the candles during the opening song. After the opening song, Mass continues as usual.

For the 10:30am Mass, we will be doing the First Form: The Procession (see Breaking Bread Missalette page 65). At the beginning of Mass, the people will **meet in Father Klink Hall** with their candles. The candles will be lit and blessed while all are gathered in the Hall. From there, after the candles are blessed, the people will process in to the church and find their seats while singing the opening song. After the procession, Mass continues as usual.

We hope you can join us for this very special celebration! It is not often this Feast falls on a Sunday, so please join us to celebrate Christ as the light of the world!

GREETINGS FROM INDIA!

After 20+ hours of travel our group of 16 people arrived in Delhi, India for the first part of our trip in the North. We have been enjoying many new and exciting adventures (like navigating the chaotic traffic) along with strong fellowship. We are seeing beautiful ancient and modern temples, historic palaces and forts, and learning about traditional Indian craftsmanship, artistry, and dance. Father Francis served an impromptu Mass for us (with permission from the parish priest) at St. Mary's Church in Agra after learning the Mass time changed due to the weather. We visited the Taj Mahal and will depart for Kerala (Father's home state) to complete the second part of our trip in the south. We hold you all in our prayers.



GOSPEL REFLECTION

A young couple in my parish told me they were expecting their second child, a baby boy. I knew that their five-year old only child Emma had been desperately wanting to be a big sister for years, so I said, "Emma must have been so happy when you told her the news." "Actually," they said, "she burst into tears. She wanted a baby sister!" How often in life God wonderfully fulfills our desires and we are sad because we don't approve of the way he does it. We want to control the gift and the delivery method.

The same thing occurs in the Gospel this week when Jesus announces in his hometown that the promise of an Anointed One bringing glad tidings to the poor is "fulfilled in your hearing" (Luke 4:21). After a moment of elation, his fellow townsfolk realize this man is the way God is fulfilling his promises, and they erupt into a violent outburst. So Jesus departs. How sad for them.

Every single Sunday at Mass, including this one, some version of this happens to many of us. God's word announces the fulfillment of God's promises in Christ, and we easily overlook or disdain it. His way is almost never according to our narrow expectations. What's required of us is to set these aside, and to embrace a new openness to God's gifts, no matter how he wishes to give them. God is fulfilling his promises the way He likes — why be sad?

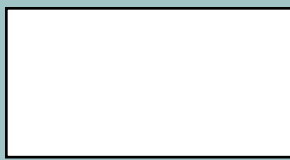
