

What is a Discipleship Quad?

A Discipleship Quad is a group of four people who journey together as disciples through weekly gatherings of fellowship, ongoing conversion, and learning. This 12-month path of accompaniment fosters growth through prayer, accountability, and authentic relationships. The process may take a few months longer than a year, depending on how often the group needs to reschedule and how quickly they go through the material.



Who is a Discipleship Quad for?

A Discipleship Quad is for any person who has a desire to grow in faith as a Catholic and will commit to adhere to all components of the Discipleship Quad Commitment. A Quad can be made up of people at any level of spiritual maturity, from long-time, committed Catholics to those who are just beginning their spiritual journey with Jesus. In addition to growing as disciples, Quad members should desire to be formed as disciple-makers.

The Benefit to the Individual

The benefit of a Discipleship Quad to each individual person is knowing the love of Jesus Christ and deepening a relationship with him. Those who have experienced that love and made the decision to follow Christ would never go back to a life without him. The reason for this is that their lives were changed forever after knowing his unconditional love. The truth is that this life is available to everyone who genuinely wants to grow in faith—who wants a relationship with our Lord and Savior. The Discipleship Quad is a proven way to help others experience such a relationship.

Pope Leo XIV's Motto and Coat of Arms

Pope Leo XIV's coat of arms offers a clear reflection of his Augustinian roots and the values he seeks to promote during his pontificate, particularly unity and communion within the Church.

The shield is divided diagonally into two sections. The upper half features a blue background with a white lily. The lower half of the shield has a light background and displays an image that recalls the Order of Saint Augustine: a closed book with a heart pierced by an arrow. This is a direct reference to the conversion experience of Saint Augustine himself, who described his personal encounter with God's Word using the phrase: "Vulnerasti cor meum verbo tuo" - "You have pierced my heart with your Word."


The Motto

Pope Leo XIV has also chosen a motto that reflects this Augustinian tradition: *In Illo uno unum*, which means "In the One, we are one." The phrase is taken from Saint Augustine's *Exposition on Psalm 127*, where he explains that "although we Christians are many, in the one Christ we are one."

In a 2023 interview with Vatican News' Tiziana Campisi, then-Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost spoke about the significance of this motto: "As can be seen from my episcopal motto, unity and communion are truly part of the charism of the Order of Saint Augustine, and also of my way of acting and thinking," he said. "I believe it is very important to promote communion in the Church, and we know well that communion, participation, and mission are the three key words of the Synod. So, as an Augustinian, for me promoting unity and communion is fundamental."

Saint Augustine's reflection on Psalm 127 highlights the theological foundation of this idea. "Christ - head and body - is one single man. And what is the body of Christ? His Church," Augustine writes. He then adds, "Although we Christians are many, in the one Christ we are one. We are many and we are one - because we are united to Him, and if our Head is in heaven, the members will follow."

PASTOR'S PEN

Eucharistic Rally at Pablo Center! What a great opportunity! The Pablo Center, Eau Claire, becomes a venue for the Eucharistic Rally on Saturday, August 9. This provides a rare occasion for the Catholics of this part of Wisconsin to gather and be renewed in faith. We should be proud to proclaim the presence of the Lord in the Eucharist. I would encourage as many as possible to attend this Rally. As seats are limited at Pablo Center, you may have to rush to register soon. Please check the bulletin for the registration and other details of the Rally.

Visits to the sick and homebound parishioners remain an important ministry. I have strived to be with sick parishioners to show our community's support and prayers. Families are invited to share information about their loved ones who live in nursing homes and similar facilities. Without that information, access to such places has become difficult. Moreover, when someone is admitted to the hospital, please mention the parish name in the admission record.

Blessings of Homes during the Easter Season is a valuable practice in the Church. The Church teaches us to sanctify everything: dwellings, places of work, all our pursuits, and the fruits of our labor. The home blessing represents a renewal of our lives in Christ. Washed in the baptismal waters, our homes become temples of the Holy Spirit for the fulfillment of the will of our Heavenly Father. This is why the Church blesses everything that can be found in a Christian home; and if something is not worthy of being blessed, there should not be a place for it in the home of a Christian. Families who desire to have their homes blessed may contact the Parish Office to arrange a time and day for blessing. After having set up your appointment, here is how to prepare for your house blessing: All who reside in the household should make every effort to be present for the Blessing. All gather in the dining/living room.

- Have an icon of Christ or a crucifix on the table. Set a lit candle
- Make a list of the baptismal names of family members you wish to pray for.
- When the priest arrives, everyone in the house should gather around the table/family altar and join in prayer and singing.
- The priest will bless all the rooms and entry areas of the home/ business place.
- Make sure your rooms are lit (if at night) and open doors to rooms for ease of entry.
- If there are children, they usually carry the icon and a candle to lead the priest from room to room. If not, the head of the household will lead the priest.
- If you have pets, make sure they become accustomed to the visitors, so they don't bark or jump up during the service. You could have your pets blessed, too.

The Scripture this Sunday. Love is a *command*. Throughout the Easter season, the first reading comes from the Acts of the Apostles. There, we get a glimpse into the life of the first disciples and their communities. The first Christian community shared everything in common, and the first thing we hear about Barnabas is that he sold his estate and laid the money at the feet of the disciples. Their witness to living their faith in the Risen Lord and his command of love encouraged others. Loving this way wasn't easy for them. In our society, certainly in our media, we focus on the emotional and physical components of love, which are the more pleasant side, and forget about the more difficult side, like commitment, fidelity, sacrifice, unselfishness, patience, forgiveness, etc. Too often, our culture tends to ignore the elements of love that entail sacrifice. Genuine love is not as easy as it looks. The first Christians' love was a *tough* love. We hear in the gospel that Jesus commands them to love one another. Jesus reminds us that love is the true mark of his followers. If we are disciples of the Lord, then love should be the mark of us. Each day, all of us are challenged to live LOVE. Jesus's command is to *love one another!*
