It was the mental health ministry led by Janet Grove that really sold me. I don't know of another church that is dedicated to mental health and meaningful ways to include everyone. The first time we came to the Advent Blessing and Dinner for those impacted by mental health challenges, Fr. John Bauer greeted us warmly and asked what brought us that night. How wonderful to feel accepted completely, that our daughter who lives with Fetal Alcohol Syndrome was welcome. She has a big heart, and we began to volunteer with the Families Moving Forward ministry that helped families in transition stay overnight for a week in Teresa of Calcutta Hall. She played with the children, held fussy babies to give the moms a break, and made conversation. She joined Juventus choir. These are huge wins.
