LENTEN LISTENING

In Lent, I am pushed out of my normal routine and invited to engage the world in a new way. In community, Lenten rituals mold my heart and mind, reminding me of what I want to do, but so often neglect.

In his 2023 Message for Lent, Pope Francis reflects on penance and the meaning of the transfiguration for our lives. He points out that Jesus does not travel to Mount Tabor alone but takes with him three disciples to be witnesses. They are invited to share this experience of grace. "For it is in togetherness that we follow Jesus."

Pope Francis states, "Lenten penance is a commitment, sustained by grace, to overcoming our lack of faith and our resistance to following Jesus on the way of the cross." He acknowledged this is hard, and we often fail. Just as the disciples struggled, so too we are called to intentionally commit—and recommit—to "deepen our knowledge of the Master, to fully understand and embrace the mystery of his salvation...to be taken aside by him and to detach ourselves from mediocrity and vanity." This journey "requires effort, sacrifice and concentration."

Pope Francis reminds us we have support on this important journey together. As Peter, James, and John ascended the mountain with Jesus, they heard the voice from the cloud say, "Listen to him" (Mt 17:5). Here is the key, Pope Francis exclaims. "It is very clear: we need to listen to Jesus. Lent is a time of grace to the extent that we listen to him as he speaks to us." He goes on, "And how does he speak to us? First, in the word of God...May that word not fall on deaf ears...In addition to the Scriptures, the Lord speaks to us through our brothers and sisters, especially in the faces and the stories of those who are in need." Every Lent, The Basilica holds a pledge drive for our St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP) Ministry. The Basilica SVdP Ministry is a unique dimension of our parish community. Blessed by the generosity of our parishioners, we have funds to help parishioners and neighbors struggling with a variety of basic needs such as housing, transportation, and food.

Together, as we hear the voice of God through our brothers and sisters in need, we remember the disciples on Mt. Tabor. Pope Francis reminds us, "Jesus came and touched them, saying, 'Rise, and do not be afraid.'" Let us walk together see, act, listen, and be open to being transformed. Let us listen to God together.

THE BASILICA LANDMARK


The first project of The Basilica Landmark, originally known as "The Friends of The Basilica", was the restoration of The Basilica Dome.

"A 1991 inspection found the damage far worse than imagined: The grit from freeway construction, shifting soils, rain, snow, and 100 degree temperature differential through out the year all combine to create a rather desperate situation."

Based on this inspection and the many repairs that The Basilica needs, it is very clear that French architect Emmanuel Masquery failed to account for Minnesota winters.

Today, the 100+ year old structure that the beautiful copper dome sits on needs our attention.

It is hard to miss the floating white panels that line the church. These are safety measures, in place to catch flaky plaster which falls as the plaster dries. Soon, scaffolding will be erected, and the loose plaster will be knocked down.



Our architects are ready to conduct a year long moisture envelope study and structural assessment. However, they cannot begin this work until we raise an additional \$300,000.
