

JESUS IS THE STAR OF OUR LIFE

Dear parishioners,

Our understanding of the mission of the newborn Christ is becoming clearer. His birth was not exclusively for the Jewish nation. It was for all nations. The feast of the Epiphany further deepens our understanding of the message of Christmas. Epiphany, which means manifestation, draws our attention to a wider implication of Jesus' birth. His birth will gradually affect all humanity because no one is excluded from his kingdom.

All men will be gathered together into the light of Christ. Prophet Isaiah spoke of this reality to his people many years ago, "Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the people; but upon you the LORD shines, and over you appears his glory. Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance."

Led by the star these men from the East came to worship the newborn child. Their presence and the gifts they offered to the new born child are symbolic and demonstrative of the mission of Jesus. Everyone comes to or is led to him. The cloud of darkness has no place in the presence of Jesus and on all who are drawn toward him. It is a new era.

Saint Paul says that God's grace is made possible in the great mystery of the Incarnation and that the plan of God which was concealed from ages past is now revealed in the birth of Jesus. This plan is made known not only to the apostles and prophets but also to us who live the Christmas joy today; and equality it restored among God's people. We are no longer separated but members of the one body, Jews and Gentiles alike.

In his eyes, we are all equal and called to remove roadblocks of hatred, stereotypes, racial discrimination and violence. It is sad and painful when we drag ourselves through the mud of racial tension and hostility, when our conversations are limited to those who think like us or look like us, when our national debates on immigration evoke such anger and resentment or when we think only of ourselves and enjoy wealth without caring for the less fortunate.

The manifestation of the Child Jesus speaks to us about our common destiny and the new family we have become. We are his people, the flock he has chosen. Jesus is the star of our life. Do you recognize him? Do you want to be led by the star? Can you see his signs?

What are these signs today? What enables you to recognize the Lord? The Magi worked together to get to their destination. Collaboration, peaceful co-existence and commitment to follow Jesus will bring you to the desired destination. In him we find light, happiness and peace. Remember, the sign is not the object, rather it guides us to our destination—a life with God. $Happy\ New\ Year!$

The Light of the Moon

If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life."

If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows the life of George Bailey from childhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance by the light of the moon?"

That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift. It is God that makes our ordinary lives extraordinary.

In the end of the movie, George Bailey realizes that he had a far greater life because, instead of being the hero of his own story, he allowed himself to reflect goodness onto others.

Remember — the magi didn't chart their own course. They merely followed the star.
