

IF I HAVE NOT LOVED, I AM NOTHING

Dear parishioners,

The call to love and follow God's directives comes with great cost. We see this in the lives of the prophets and others who responded to God's invitation to service. Even in our own lives, we can testify that to serve God and humanity has serious consequences. Today's scripture readings highlight the difficulties and frightening ramifications of saying yes to God's calling.

Prophet Jeremiah was aware of this serious challenge and was reluctant to accept the call. He foresaw the opposition awaiting him. Jesus' mission was similar to that of Jeremiah. Jesus was not spared by his own people. Their initial negative reaction; antagonism and opposition from his contemporaries ultimately led to his death. Jesus' repeated attempts to bring hope to his own people were smashed on the rocks of deafness and hostility as today's gospel tells us.

What should we do? Should we turn a deaf ear to God's calling? Should we not speak of his Words? Should we allow fear and suffering to suppress our ability to love and serve one another in truth? The calling of the prophet Jeremiah teaches us something new. First, we learn that God is the one who calls and invites us to share in his life; a life of love and truth. By ourselves, and without God's invitation we cannot really come to know or practice love. God chose to love us long before we came to love him. We cannot make progress in love unless we know we are loved by the Father, who is the source of love. God is love and that is the central teaching of Jesus Christ. Jeremiah and Jesus made it their mission to communicate this to us.

In today's Gospel we see how Jesus is attacked by his townsfolk, even though he speaks nothing but the language of love. Jeremiah was scared to death even though he spoke the language of love to his people. Why are we so prone to hate and not love? Why is our society unwilling to tolerate and live in harmony? Jesus says that he was sent to bring glad tidings to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives. The language of love calls for a radical change in one's life. Those who are not willing or ready to make this change sometimes turn to violence. At his home town they wanted to put Jesus down by throwing him off the cliff. The impulse to react angrily or violently when our desire is not met is what love is against.

"Now I will show you the way which surpasses all the others.' says Saint Paul in his letter to the Christians of Corinth. He goes on speaking about the primacy of love and why it is the bedrock of relationships. Love is the most important thing in human life. However, we still find it difficult to explain. But, if we allow Paul's words to influence us, we can feel their power, simplicity and truth in our innermost being.

Without love, all accomplishment is nothing. Our intelligence, our ability to do great things, even sacrificing ourselves, means nothing without possession of love. Indeed, love is the "fragment of eternity that dwells in us." Refusal to love leads the world to darkness and destruction. Love and be loved.

"Love is patient, love is kind ..." As familiar as these words are, they never seem to stray into the territory of becoming trite or silly. At their core they communicate a truth about us and about our Creator that never fails to inspire.

But despite the fact that you've probably heard it at many weddings over time, First Corinthians isn't just for newlyweds. It wasn't written for married folks. It's for every single one of us, in every state of life and every social situation, in every country and culture and language across the globe.

Which means that First Corinthians is even for the online world. It's for Facebook and Twitter and Instagram and all the other platforms I'm forgetting (there seems to be a new one every day, doesn't there?).

A sense of division — whether rooted in politics, culture or anything else — is growing in our world, and it's never more obvious than when we observe interactions online. It is far easier, after all, to remember what love is when a human being of flesh and blood stands before us. When all we see is an avatar or a profile picture on a screen especially accompanied by an opinion with which we vehemently disagree — even the most loving Christians can throw First Corinthians out the window.

As everyday stewards we know that we are charged to be not only gracious but grateful. We receive others but we also give thanks for what they bring to us — even if that's an opportunity to "strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts."

So before the next time you post anything online, I suggest giving First Corinthians a read — and remember, love never fails.




