Ordinary....boring or opportunity? So here we are in Ordinary Time again. The season has changed, and we are back to the Ordinary. You know, it's fitting that most of the Church year is spent in Ordinary Time; the majority of our lives are lived in ordinary ways, with ordinary days and ordinary tasks. The ordinary teaches us a great deal; how to live, how to love, how to work, how to relax, how to pray, how to worship, how to be. It is in the ordinary that we come to know our selves, our gifts and talents, our strengths, and our weaknesses, and it is in the



ordinary that we learn to appreciate what we have and how we share it. Sometimes we think ordinary is boring, the same old thing, a rut we are stuck in. But there can be comfort in the ordinary. And there is opportunity in the ordinary as well. Sometimes it is a matter of attitude...how do we look at the things we do every day? Do we see them as boring and tedious, or do we see them as opportunities to do better today what we did yesterday? If we see the ordinary as boring, that is what it will be and stuck in the rut is where we will find ourselves. And we will feel stuck and mired down; unable to appreciate what is in our daily living...perhaps relationships will become stale, and boredom will set in, and perhaps depression as well, because we lose a sense of fulfillment in accomplishing the tasks of the day-to-day. If, however, we look at the ordinary as the school for the extraordinary, we may discover that the tasks that repeat themselves, the chores that are commonplace, the people right in front of us are in fact the most important and most worthy of our time, energy, and love. When we take the time to complete the ordinary with care and intentionality and focus on those who benefit most from our actions, we gift them with our truest selves. Then, when the extraordinary moments occur, they fill us more fully with wonder and awe; we celebrate them and rejoice in them and do not take them for
