From the Desk of Fr. Beckman:

"After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like dove" (Luke 3:21). Jesus first unites

us to himself in baptism. The Trinity is on full display here, as Jesus, beginning his public ministry, is baptized by the Holy Spirit through the ministry of John the Baptist. Not only do we witness Jesus participating in an act that will become the cornerstone of initiation into the Christian faith, but we see it facilitated by a human whose divinity is as precarious as our own. Jesus is both fully human and fully divine. In this scene his humanity is on display. He receives the sacrament of baptism, and participates in the act that our own lives require to gain entry into heaven. As Jesus said, "No one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and spirit" (John 3:5). Jesus needed baptism to fulfill scripture and to show that God is fully participating in human life, unto death, and thus dignify human life and make it worthy of heaven. His baptism sanctifies our humanity. It makes human life dignified and special when we know God shared it with us and wants to share his eternal life with us. St. Paul, writes in his pastoral epistle to Titus, "He saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he richly poured out on us through Jesus Christ our savior, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life" (Titus 3:5b-7). We should all live out our own baptism as children of God giving glory and praise to his name in all that we say and do every day of our lives. That's what it means to be a child of God.


