

Brothers and Sisters,

In today's second reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Philippians, St. Paul is encouraging us to be imitators of him, because he is striving to imitate Jesus. In his encouragement to let our lives be in imitation of Jesus' life he is also calling us to conversion.
