

# Why send your kids to Summer Camp-Totus Tuus, Camp Summit or Steubenville Rochester?

If you've been taking your son or daughter to church since they were born, it's easy for them to think of it as just something their parents believe. Most youngsters don't make such a statement until high school or college, but it remains a "family faith' rather than a personal one. 


