

Brothers and Sisters,

I am sure you are very familiar with setting goals. The activities and relationships of our life have much more meaning and richness when we have goals in mind. Whether that goal be one of personal improvement, job or school related it brings focus and purpose to day-to-day life. The spiritual life is no different. We hear in the second reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians that St. Paul has a goal. That goal is eternal life and to be with Jesus. He even goes on to say that he is so focused on this goal that he counts the other things of life as rubbish. He then places his efforts toward this goal firmly on the hope of Jesus Christ who is our life and love.

You and I will probably not count the things or the relationships of our life as rubbish, yet by having goals in our spiritual life those things and relationships of life find deeper meaning in the presence of God. Life is not rubbish, yet without the presence of God, known through some spiritual goals, life can grow monotonous. God created us for joy and peace. Be confident, as is St. Paul, that in the hope that with Jesus your spiritual practices will bring you to the eternal life prepared for you!
