





## **Prayer**

Teaching your child to pray is an important part of your vocation as a parent. Here are five steps to help you!

- 1. Pray with your child. The best way to teach your kids how to pray is to pray with them. Praise & thank God, ask God for forgiveness, ask God for what you need, pray for others & our world.
- 2. Pray over your children. Make the sign of the cross on their forehead and offer

a prayer for them aloud.

- 3. Talk about prayer and what it means. You can tell your kids what prayer means to you, why you like to pray, explain what prayer is, and ask them their thoughts about prayer.
- 4. Help them memorize prayers. I've sent home prayers to memorize for each grade.
- 5. Be an example. If you want your children to understand the importance of prayer and to make it part of their daily lives, set the example. Make time for prayer in your day.
