

MARCH 12, 2023 (3RD SUNDAY OF LENT)

FROM FATHER TOM

Brothers and Sisters,

I hope your Lent is bringing about a fresh experience of the grace of our Lord. It is such a wonderful time to commit more deeply to daily conversation with God in our personal prayer, demonstrate our love for God by fasting from some good item, such as ice cream, to give that little sacrifice to God as an act of love, and a wonderful time to exercise gratitude and generosity by specifically remembering the poor through our almsgiving.

For all of us that are blessed to have Irish ancestry Friday, March 17 will be a day of celebration as we honor St. Patrick. Bishop Barron understands our joy to celebrate St. Patrick's Feast Day and has given us a dispensation from the usual practice of abstaining from meat on the Friday's of Lent. Please see his letter in the bulletin. While most of the celebrations of St. Patrick's Day revolves around some green liquid and eating corned beef, it is even better to let those celebrations be preceded by prayer. St. Patrick lived a heroic life of faith and gave witness to Christ's love so powerfully that his witness of faith endures even to this contemporary age. Let us not only honor him, let us also pray with him, so that the love of Christ which transformed his life may transform our lives to be powerful witnesses to God's mercy and love.

(Say this aloud with your best Irish accent) "A few prayers to precede the drinking and eating and maybe the every day."

I bind unto myself today the power of God to hold and lead, His eye to watch, His might to stay, His ear to hearken to my need: the wisdom of my God to teach, His hand to guide, His shield to ward; the Word of God to give me speech, His heavenly host to be my guard.

Christ be with me, Christ within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ to comfort me and restore me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ in the hearts of all that love me, Christ in the mouth of friend and stranger.

I bind unto myself the Name, the strong Name of the Trinity, by invocation of the same, the Three in One, and One in Three, of Whom all nature hath creation; Eternal Father, Spirit, Word: praise to the Lord of my salvation, salvation is of Christ the Lord. Amen

I bind myself to God's power to guide me, God's might to uphold me, God's wisdom to teach me, God's Eye to watch

over me, God's Ear to hear me, God's way to lie before me, God's shield to shelter me, God's host to secure me...Against the snares of demons, against the seductions of vices, against the lusts of nature, against everyone who meditates injury to me, whether far or near, few or many. God bless you, Fr. Tom

Signs of Spring


