

FROM FATHER TOM

Brothers and Sisters,

"Beloved:

If you are patient when you suffer for doing what is good,

this is a grace before God.

For to this you have been called,

because Christ also suffered for you,

leaving you an example that you should follow in his footsteps.

He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth."

These are the first lines of the Second reading from Mass today. St. Peter reminds us of a very uncomfortable part of our discipleship, suffering. We are called to imitate Jesus and a part of that imitation is suffering. I don't mean the kind of suffering that comes with illness, disease, or old age, rather the suffering that comes from encountering evil. We are called, by Jesus, to be a presence of good in the world. To pursue good and to let our lives be a witness of good to the world. In that work of being good and witnessing good we will encounter people, and circumstances that are not interested in what is good, especially the good of love, forgiveness, and peace that Jesus asks to give witness to. St. Peter reminds us of Jesus' first instructions to his disciples, the Sermon on the Mount, where he gave us the beatitudes. "Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you, falsely, because of me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven." Living and witnessing the good is not easy. Yet, it is the way to eternal love and peace. We need to pray for perseverance, and we need to keep the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus in our minds and on our hearts. Through his great acts of goodness and love we have received the very life of God. Let us be unafraid of what we may encounter in the world and truly rejoice in the good that God has given us through Jesus. Live good, do good and be assured of the life, peace and love that never ends.



The Catholic Church teaches that in receiving the Body of Christ alone the communicant receives both the body and blood of the risen Lord. To receive under both kinds is a fuller sign of communion but is not better. It is appropriate that during special celebrations or seasons of the Church year to receive the Eucharist under both kinds more fully signifies the sacrifice, love, and communion Christ desires to have with his people. 
