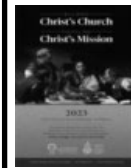

**May Cemetery Appeal**

Dear Friends in Faith: Every year in May we send letters  
out regarding our Cemetery Appeal. You should be  
receiving those soon. There also will be envelopes available  
at both entrances and can be filled out and put in the  
collection plate or dropped off at the Parish Center.  
Each spring, our cemeteries become places for visitation  
and remembrance, especially at Memorial Day. Ours is a  
small cemetery operation, with six developed acres: and at  
times our needs exceed our income, given the challenges  
that come with aging equipment, roads, and monuments.  
Our operating expenses average about \$8,000 annually.  
Less than half of these costs are financed by fees for lots,  
along with perpetual care dividends. Thus, we depend on  
the **generous contributions** of our faithful benefactors each  
year. We rely on your assistance in this work of mercy.  
May we count you among our contributors this year? As  
always, your contribution will be used exclusively for  
cemetery activity. As a more lasting legacy, we also invite  
to remember our cemetery in your will, whether for its  
routine operations or its perpetual care endowment.  
Join us for the **Memorial Day Mass** at St. Joachim Church  
(8:30 am), as you visit the cemetery or remember your  
beloved deceased elsewhere that day. And please know that

**Question & Answer:**

Can Catholics Gamble?

**Question:** The Bible says that Jesus condemned gambling, but I notice that so many parishes have them at festivals and other events. What's correct?

**Answer:** Although Jesus speaks of our relationship with material wealth and the very human struggle with greed, the gospels do not include any specific instructions related to gambling. At the same time, the Church is very sensitive to the needs of those who might struggle with an addiction to gambling, and pastoral care should always be offered to those who struggle with this reality in their life. While it is true that many parish or school communities include gambling or games of chance in festivals and fundraisers (e.g. bingo, roulette, ring tossing, dunking booths, etc.), there is nothing inherently wrong these sorts of events, given they are played fairly and within the limits of reason are not morally objectionable. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us: "Games of chance (card games, etc.) or wagers are not in themselves contrary to justice. They become morally unacceptable when they deprive someone of what is necessary to provide for his needs and those of others" As in all things, moderation and a sense of healthy limits should be applied to gambling and games of chance. For those who find themselves living with addiction to gambling, help is available in various 12-step and addiction recovery programs. ©LPi

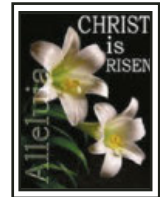
