Born of noble and wealthy parents in France, he was commissioned by our Lady to found the order of Our Lady of Mercy for the Ransom of Captives. When all the funds of the work were exhausted, the religious were bound by their rule to take the places of the prisoners with the infidels. He died in 1256.

St. Francis de Sales, Bishop/Doctor, III Class

Born in 1567, he would be sent Chablais in France where his preaching brought back sixty thousand Calvinists to the Catholic Faith. He founded the order of the Visitation and was known for his apostolic zeal and gentle holiness. A prolific writer, his most celebrated books are the *Introduction to the Devout Life* and the *Treatise on the Love of God*. He died in 1622.

St. Martina, Virgin/Martyr, III Class

A noble Roman virgin, St. Martina suffered martyrdom during the persecution of Alexander Severus about 228.

St. John Bosco, Confessor, III Class

Born in 1815 and raised by a saintly mother, he would become a priest and, on account of his tremendous confidence in God, accomplish numerous works in spite of tremendous obstacles. Moved by compassion towards the young, especially of the poorer classes, he founded schools and orphanages and employed all his talents – and sense of humor – in the Christian formation of them. His charity, humility, and kindness were well-known. He died in 1888.

One of the finest examples of a bishop in the early Church, he was condemned to the wild beasts and sent to Rome in chains. On his way there, he wrote magnificent letters to the churches, exhorting obedience to the Church, and in which his great love of Christ and ardent desire for martyrdom find expression: "I am the wheat of Christ; may I be ground by the fangs of wild beasts and become a bread with no impurity." He died around 110.

The Purification is a festival of light. The blessing and procession of candles recalls the manifestation of Christ as the Light of the world, received in the temple by Simeon as God's messenger: *A light of revelation to the Gentiles and a glory for Thy people Israel*. It is one of the oldest, if not the oldest, of the Marian feasts.

Candlemas Day is this Saturday, February 2, which is also First Saturday. As was mentioned, Bishop Cozzens regrettably had to cancel (but will now come for Holy Thursday!). Still, there will be a Solemn Mass at 9:00 AM beginning with the blessing, distribution and procession of candles in honor of our Lady. Plan to attend this most fitting close of the Christmas liturgical season before we transition into Lent.

Please note that, due to the preparations needed for the Mass, there will not be exposition and Benediction this Saturday.

Throat Blessings will follow the Masses next Sunday for the feast of St. Blase, bishop and martyr. The blessing is as follows: *Through the intercession of St. Blase, bishop and martyr, may God free you from maladies of the throat, and from all other evil.*

First Friday and Saturday are this week. Among His other promises to those who devoutly assist at Mass on First Friday in reparation to His Sacred Heart, Our Lord said that He would give special graces to priests to reach hardened souls. The First Saturdays are kept in reparation for the blasphemies and offenses against our Lady's Immaculate Conception, her perpetual virginity, her divine and spiritual Maternity, her sacred images, and neglect of parents to foster devotion to her in their children. All are *most encouraged* to attend Mass and devotions these days.

A Final Thought...

Under the gaze of God, we are delivered from the constraint of having to be "the best" or perpetually having to be "winners." We have a deep sense of release, because we don't have to make constant efforts to show ourselves in a favorable light or waste energy pretending to be what we are not. We can quite simply be what we are. There is no better form of "relaxation than to rest like little children in the tenderness of a Father who loves us."

We find it so difficult to accept our own deficiencies because we imagine they make us unlovable. Since we are defective in this or that aspect, we feel that we do not deserve to be loved. Living under God's gaze make us realize how mistaken that is. Love is given freely, it's not deserved, and our deficiencies do not prevent God from loving us—just the opposite. Thus we are freed of the terrible, despair-inducing sense that we must become "good enough" to be loved.

But while it "authorizes" us to be ourselves, the poor sinners we are, God's gaze also enables us to be supremely daring in our desire for holiness. We have the right to aspire to the summit, to aspire to the highest levels of holiness, because God wants it and is able to grant it. We are never imprisoned within our own mediocrity or sort of forced into a dull resignation, for we always have the hope of advancing in love. God can make us, sinners that we are, into saints: His grace can accomplish even that miracle, and we can have unlimited faith in the power of His love. Even if we fall every day, as long as we get up again and say, "Lord, thank you, because I'm sure that you will make me a saint!" we give immense pleasure to God and sooner or later will receive from Him what we hope for.

The right attitude toward God, then, is having a very peaceful, very "relaxed" acceptance of ourselves and our weaknesses as well as an immense desire for holiness, and a strong determination to progress, based on limitless trust in God's grace. We don't all have in us the stuff of sages or heroes. But by God's grace we do have the stuff of saints. That is the baptismal robe we put on when we received the Sacrament that made us God's children. (*continued*)


