A Final Thought...

There is a deep two-way connection between acceptance of ourselves and acceptance of other people. Each strengthens the other. Often we fail to accept others because, deep down, we do not accept ourselves. If we are not at peace with ourselves we will necessarily find ourselves at war with other people. Non-acceptance of self creates an inner tension, a sense of dissatisfaction and frustration that is then taken out on others, who become scapegoats for our inner conflict. So, for instance, when we are in a bad mood with people around us, very often it is because we are discontented with ourselves! As someone once observed: "I have gradually come to realize that on those days when you are at odds with your neighbors, you are really at odds with yourself. 'Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself.'" Conversely, if we close our hearts against other people, make no effort to love them as they are, never learn to be reconciled to them, we will never have the grace to practice the deep reconciliation with ourselves that we need. Instead, we will be perpetual victims of our own narrow-heartedness and harsh judgments towards our neighbor.

Having now looked at self-acceptance, we can now consider acceptance of events. The basic principle is the same: we cannot change our lives effectively unless we begin by accepting them, welcoming them totally, and so consenting to all the external events that confront us. This isn't hard in the case of what we perceive as good, pleasing, and positive. But it is hard when any kind of setback or suffering is involved. But this subject needs to be handled carefully. It is not a matter of becoming passive and learning to endure everything without reacting. But whatever projects we have and however well we plan them, many times situations that are beyond our control and involve a whole host of events contrary to our expectations, hopes, and desires occur, and we must accept it. We should not limit ourselves to accepting things grudgingly, but should truly consent to them—not endure them, but in a sense "choose" them (even if, in fact we have no choice, and that is what annoys us). Choosing here means making a free act by which we not only resign ourselves but welcome the situation. That isn't easy, especially in the case of really painful trials, but it is the right approach. If we have enough faith in God to believe Him capable of drawing good out of whatever befalls us, He will do so. *As you believed so let it be done to you*, Christ repeatedly says.
