The Traditional Latin Mass Explained

??? What is the distinction between the Low Mass, High Mass, and Solemn Mass?

In the Extraordinary Form, there are two primary types of Masses celebrated: the spoken or "Low" Mass, and the "Sung" Mass (sometimes referred to as High Mass).

***Low Mass** is celebrated by a priest assisted by one or more altar boys. The prayers are spoken (in Latin), and much of the Mass of the Faithful (after the offertory) is almost inaudible, in imitation of the ancient Jewish liturgies given by God to Moses, and emphasizing the fact that we are faced with a profound mystery.

During Low Mass, only the altar servers respond to the priest. The priest alone says the Pater Noster prayer (Our Father), and only he assumes the Orans prayer position (hands extended and held shoulder-width apart).

***High Mass (Sung Mass)** is normally celebrated every Sundays, as well as Holy Days of Obligation and other special feasts throughout the year. Sung Mass includes the Asperges before Mass, in which the priest sprinkles the congregation with Holy Water as part of the opening liturgical ceremony. Sung Mass is so called because many of the prayers of the Mass are sung by the priest, choir, or schola. Sung Mass also usually employs the use of incense. At Sung Mass, the faithful chant the Kyrie, Gloria, Credo,

Sanctus and Agnus Dei with the Schola (choir). The congregation also responds to the Priest in chant during multiple points during the Mass.

***Solemn Mass (also known as a Solemn High Mass)**, a type of Sung mass, is the full ceremonial form of the Tridentine Mass, celebrated by a priest with a deacon and a subdeacon, requiring most of the parts of the Mass to be sung, and the use of incense. The parts assigned to the deacon and subdeacon are often done by priests in vestments proper to those roles.

??? I'm new to the Traditional Latin Mass and am not sure how to follow or what's going on...

In non-Covid-19 times we have hymnal/missals available in each pew so that everyone can follow not just the Propers (the readings and particular prayers of the day) but also all of the action of the Mass. We are not, at this time, able to provide those. However, there is help...

Starting this weekend, a limited number of sheets will be available near the entrances (by the bulletins) so that you can follow the Propers - the Introit, Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Gospel, Offertory, Secret, Communion, and Post-Communion Prayer. Some people have *Missals* which contains all of these prayers, but these little sheets can serve as a good start...

As the priest offers the prayers of the Mass, do not be worried if you have problems following the Latin or keeping up with the priest in the missal. St. Padre Pio recommends during the Mass to "keep your mind focused on the mystery that is unfolding before your eyes. In your mind's eye transport yourself to Calvary and meditate on the Victim who offers Himself to Divine Justice, paying the price of your redemption."

Keeping All These Things

I was recently asked what my favourite thing about praying the Breviary was. I paused to think about the richness of the Divine Office. How could I possibly choose my favourite part? Beyond the indisputably beautiful Psalms there are the Gregorian melodies, the moving antiphons for particular feast days, the excerpts from writings of the Church Fathers, the recounting of the glorious lives of the saints at Matins, the pleas for angelic protection at Compline... I could go on. At every turn in the Office, as in the Holy Mass, Holy Mother Church is offering her children an unexpected beauty, a new insight, or a more complete way to surrender to Christ. I have discovered in this first year at the convent that the Divine Office is the song that my heart did not know it desired to sing. This truth was reaffirmed for me on the feast of the Dedication of the Archbasilica of the Most Holy Saviour on November 9th.

I remember my initial reaction of perplexity in noting the common prayers for the dedication of a church in the breviary. The concept of dedicating a church was vague and unfamiliar to me. Holy Mother Church graciously offered to show me what my heart did not yet know I desired to pray. As the feast of the Dedication of the Archbasilica of the Most Holy Saviour went on, and I prayed the prayers that the Office instructed me to pray, I was offered my little seed of reflection for the day: God desires to dwell with us. God desires to dwell *in* us. What a magnificent reality. The God Who created heaven, Who has no need of anything whatsoever, desires to confine Himself to the tabernacle of the church and the tabernacle of my body so that I can *be* with Him.

After my long pause, I finally answered the Sister who asked me about my favourite part of the Office. "I love how it takes care of us." Holy Mother Church is a trustworthy Mother who offers us what we need even when we do not know we need it. In her we can all be made fitting dwelling places of the Most High.




