My Sunday Rosary

Every Sunday I offer the holy rosary for the intentions of the parishioners of All Saints. What a gift it is to be here, and to pray for and with all of you. I would like to share a few reflections on what it is like to be a Sister at this parish.

Often on Sunday, I pray the rosary with many of you before the High Mass. I experience great peace hearing one of the men of the parish leading us all in prayer. Thank you to the many strong and committed fathers of families who like Saint Joseph, make many sacrifices so that their families will be nourished spiritually, and formed well in the faith. You are an example to me, and to all, of the Heavenly Father. Please know that I am praying for you, as yours is a great responsibility. Especially when I pray the Our Fathers of the rosary, I am remembering you.

How inspired I am by the many beautiful mothers of this parish! Frankly, I am amazed by your witness of love, generosity, and creativity in raising and forming your children in the faith. On a practical level, just coming to Holy Mass with little children can be a difficult undertaking! Please know that Our Lord is so pleased with your efforts, and that He loves to see you and your little ones at Holy Mass. After all, He said, "Let the little children be, and do not hinder them from coming to me, for of such is the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 19:14). You are fulfilling His command. Like Our Lady, you are raising "the Child Jesus" in your little ones. I remember you especially when I pray the many Hail Marys of my rosary.

And the children! How much joy they bring me with their bright faces and sense of wonder. I love to see them at Holy Mass, learning to pray and to love Our Lord. I have the great privilege of

helping to prepare some of them for First Holy Communion, and I am so edified by their questions and comments every Sunday. It is clear to me that what I am teaching them is also being taught at home. Their sense of humor is also delightful! I am so happy to remember these dear little ones when I pray my rosary, asking especially praying that their innocence will be protected, and that they will grow up strong in the Lord.

I pray for the single people of our parish. There are so many hardworking men and women, living humble lives, dedicated to God's service. I pray for those young people who are seeking their vocation. Be courageous, be generous, and trust in Him, dear brothers and sisters in Christ! He will lead you if you earnestly seek His will. Like Our Lady, do not be afraid to say yes to Him.

I am inspired by the older people of this parish. You remind me of Simeon and Anna, the wise and holy man and woman who were waiting for the Messiah, faithfully following the inspirations of the Holy Spirit. Seeing you pray makes me wish to persevere in this spiritual battle. You are a witness to all of us of faithfulness. I pray that you will continue to lead others by your example until the end of your life, which is really only the beginning...you are getting close to Heaven!

In the back of the church there is a box in which you may leave prayer requests for the Sisters. When I pray the rosary on Sunday, I like to gather all of these requests up in my heart and present them to the Lord. It is humbling to be entrusted with your petitions.

Thank you, dear parishioners for being who you are...beautiful examples of saints in the making! Please know that I pray for you every day, but in a very particular way when I pray my holy rosary on Sunday. I also offer my Holy Communion for you each Sunday. In your charity, please pray for us Sisters too...we also want to become saints!

FINAL THOUGHT - *The Liturgical Year*, Dom Prosper Gueranger

The subject offered to our consideration on this Second Sunday is one of the utmost importance for the holy Season. The Church applies to us the lesson which our Savior gave to three of His Apostles. Let us endeavor to be more attentive to it than they were.

Jesus was about to pass from Galilee into Judea, that He might go up to Jerusalem and be present at the Feast of the Pasch. It was that last Pasch, which was to begin with the immolation of the figurative lamb, and end with the sacrifice of the Lamb of God, who taketh away the sins of the world. Jesus would have his disciples know Him. His works had borne testimony to Him, even to those who were, in a manner, strangers to Him; but as for his Disciples, had they not every reason to be faithful to Him, even to death? Had they not listened to his words, which had such power with them that they forced conviction? Had they not experienced his love, which it was impossible to resist? and had they not seen how patiently He had borne with their strange and untoward ways? Yes, they must have known Him. They had heard one of their company, Peter, declare that He was the *Christ, the Son of the Living God*. Notwithstanding this, the trial to which their faith was soon to be put, was to be of such a terrible kind that Jesus would mercifully arm them against temptation by an extraordinary grace.

The Cross was to be a *scandal and stumbling block* to the Synagogue, and alas! to more than it. Jesus said to His Apostles, at the Last Supper: *All of you shall be scandalized in me this night*. Carnal-minded as they then were, what would they think, when they should see Him seized by armed men, handcuffed, hurried from one tribunal to another, and He doing nothing to defend Himself! And then they found that the High Priests and Pharisees, who had hitherto been so often foiled by the wisdom and miracles of Jesus, had now succeeded in their conspiracy against Him—what a shock to their confidence! But there was to be something more trying still: the people who, but a few days before, greeted Him so enthusiastically with their *hosannas*, would demand His execution, and He would have to die between two thieves on the Cross, amidst the insults of His triumphant enemies.

Is it not to be feared that these Disciples of His, when they witness His humiliations and sufferings, will lose their courage? They have lived in His company for three years; but when they see that the things He foretold would happen to Him are really fulfilled, will the remembrance of all they have seen and heard keep them loyal to Him? or will they turn cowards and flee from Him?—Jesus selects three out of the number who are especially dear to Him: Peter, whom He has made the Rock, on which His Church is to be built, and to whom He has promised the Keys of the kingdom of heaven; James, *the son of Thunder*, who is to be the first Martyr of the Apostolic College; and John, James' brother, and His own Beloved Disciple. Jesus has resolved to take them aside, and show them a glimpse of that glory which, until the day fixed for its manifestation, He conceals from the eyes of mortals.

This transfiguration of the Son of Man, this manifestation of His glory, lasted but a few moments; His mission was not on Tabor; it was humiliation and suffering in Jerusalem. He therefore withdrew into Himself the brightness He had allowed to transpire; and when He came to the three Apostles, who, on hearing the voice from the cloud, had fallen on their faces with fear—they could see no one save only Jesus. The bright cloud was gone; Moses and Elias had disappeared. What a favor they have had bestowed upon them! Will they remember what they have seen and heard? They have had such a revelation of the Divinity of their dear Master!—is it possible than when the hour of trial comes, they will forget it and doubt His being God? and when they see Him suffer and die, be ashamed of Him and deny Him?




