Son of a rich merchant, St. Francis gave up all his possessions to espouse his "Lady Poverty", taking the Gospel literally, to embrace a life of evangelical poverty in total destitution but also in the perfect joy of a soul set free. Many others would join him to which he gave a Rule, and then founded with St. Clare the order for women; in 1221, he established a Third Order for the lay, which exerted considerable influence in effecting a renewal of the Christian life among all classes. Granted the gift of the Stigmata, he died on October 4, 1226, his soul being seen as a flash of light ascending to heaven.

It was customary in the Middle Ages for nobility to wear crowns of flowers as "chaplets." These crowns were offered to persons of distinction as a sign of reverence. Our Lady has the right to the same homage, and so the Church asks us to offer her a three-fold chaplet, or three crowns of roses, to which she has given the name 'Rosary'. This feast was established to commemorate the victory at Lepanto over the Muslims on October 7, 1571, a favor due to the recitation of the Rosary.

Farewells - Sister Petra Maria, F.L.M.

Nobody likes saying goodbye, whether it is to your best friends who have been over to your home for dinner, or your last child moving out of the house. Nobody likes to bid a loved one farewell, especially when you don't know when, or maybe even if, you will see him again in this life.

There are the everyday, normal goodbyes, such as those we say to our best friends on Sundays after visiting with them after Holy Mass. There are also harder goodbyes: the goodbye to a child moving out of the house, to relatives who have come for a visit after a year away, and goodbyes to people met on one occasion whom you may never see again, but whom you will carry in your heart forever.

Goodbyes are part of life, but they are hard and they often hurt. It's the farewell we say to our loved ones that hurt more. It's the ones we say to our loved ones when it is a long-term goodbye, be it just a long time-or until the next life, that hurt the most. It isn't until we part ways with our close family and friends that we realize just how much we love them and how much we want to stay with them. Mary had to say goodbye to

her Son for a time when He ascended into Heaven, and she remained on earth. I am sure she was the most joyful human person present at her Son's glorious Ascension! But, oh, what longing she must have felt to be with Him, what anticipation she must have experienced at the thought of being reunited with her Beloved Son!

In one way, goodbyes are part of being human. We cannot bi-locate, and we cannot stop time.

There is a supernatural aspect to goodbyes. Goodbyes detach our hearts from an inordinate attachment to others. They allow us to attach ourselves to God, Who is always with us, and with Whom we desire to be eternally. Everything else changes and even the human relationships we cherish the most must change. Only God does not change. The pain we experience on saying farewell to someone serves to remind us that while we love the person, we must not allow ourselves to be too attached to others, that we might attach ourselves to God. Saying goodbye hurts, but it serves the beautiful purpose of allowing us to be more with God, to Whom we need not, indeed *must* not, ever say goodbye.

FINAL THOUGHT - Dom Prosper Gueranger on Today's Holy Gospel for the 19th Sunday After Pentecost

Set thus before us, both at the beginning and at the close of the liturgical season, over which the Holy Spirit reigns supreme—this parable is, as it were, the interpreter of the whole portion of the Year, which it thus hems in: it is an additional revelation of the true aim of the Church. But how much has the light not increased, since the first time we had these mystery-telling allegories! The *certain man (homo quidam)*, who made a great supper, and invited many, is the *King, who makes a marriage for his Son*, and in this marriage, gives us an image of the *Kingdom of heaven*. The world's history, too, has been developing, as we gather from the terms respectively used by the two Evangelists. Those who were the first invited and contented themselves with declining the kindness of the Master of the House, have grown in their impious ingratitude; *laying hands* on the messengers sent them by the loving kindness of the *King* they treat them with contumely, and put them to death! And now at last, in spite of the refusal of God's Chosen People, in spite of the treacherous opposition put by them against the celebration of the Nuptials of the Son of God, *all things are ready for the Marriage*, and the banquet hall is *filled with guests*.

Our heavenly King has confided to the ministers of his love the work of calling, and from every people, the new Guests: but now that his ambassadors, according to his command, have traversed the whole earth, bringing together all nations for this day of the joy of his heart—he himself is coming in person, to see that nothing is wanting to the due preparation for the Feast, and give the signal for the eternal banquet of the divine Nuptials. Now for such a feast, and in such a place, if there be any deficiency, it can only be on the part of the Guests. Let them, then, be careful not to draw down upon themselves, in this general and last examination, the displeasure of the great King, who has called them to an alliance with himself. Though he have condescended to call them, notwithstanding their extreme poverty, from the public streets and highways, he has given them abundant time to lay aside their tatters; and knowing that they could not get ready of themselves, he has placed at their disposal for the marriage feast the richest garments of his grace and virtues. Woe then, to him who on the last day shall be found not having the wedding garment of charity! such a want would admit of no excuse; and the King would justly punish it by excluding the guilty man from the feast, as one that had insulted his Son.
