

Please note that candles will not be accepted before these dates, neither will they be accepted on February 2nd itself. After the High Mass on February 2nd the candles will be transferred from the sanctuary to the table in the narthex (entry) area by the men of the parish, where they may be collected by you within the week.

Reflections on the Sacred Heart of Jesus:

My Jesus, What is It to Receive Your Love?

God's love is the foundation of all reality. We have been created, redeemed, and pursued in love to the end of union with the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. No matter what else changes, no matter what else shifts beneath our feet or slips through our fingers, the great reality of God's love is unchangeable. Jesus holds out His Most Sacred Heart to us today, just as He did yesterday, just as He will do tomorrow. If we desire to live in reality, we must embrace the truth of His unchanging love for us. The more we receive His love and let His love transform us, the more we will be living in reality.

My Jesus, what is it to receive Your love? How is this little creature meant to receive and hold her Creator?

God designed the world to reveal Himself to man and to lead man into union with Him, so He must have placed in our midst some examples that will teach us how we are meant to receive this most tender love of Jesus. Who excels in the art of receptivity? Two examples come to my mind: the newborn child and the bride. How does a newborn baby receive the love of his mother? He allows her to provide for every need. How does a bride receive the love of her bridegroom? She lets herself be carried by him. In both instances, the receptivity is a surrender to the lover. The beloved lets the lover lead; the beloved trusts the lover.

The Lord Jesus is the great Lover of each man's heart, and His jealousy demands the complete surrender of our hearts to Him. This surrender of heart is our lifelong goal and journey. We do well on this journey to continually put ourselves in contact with Jesus. For the better we come to know Him, the more we will realize that He is entirely loveable, entirely trustworthy, and entirely worthy of our surrender to Him. The traits you love most in every person you hold dear are found in all their splendor and perfection in the Person of Jesus. We must fill our ears with His words, fill our mind's eye with His Holy Face, fill our imagination with the gentleness of His voice, and it will not take us long to desire to be filled with Him.

Let us place ourselves in contact with Him. First and foremost, let us receive Him in His very Flesh, Blood, Soul, and Divinity at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Let us allow Him to heal our hearts and relieve us of our sins in the Sacrament of Confession. Let us create times of silence amidst the endless busyness and noise of life so that we can sit with Him in peace. Let us read spiritual books that we find life-giving and insightful to His Heart. Let us gently turn our hearts to Him often so that He can offer His encouragement and counsel to us. In these ways and countless others, we will proceed on our journey to union with the Lord Jesus. We will learn what it is to receive His love and to become the men and women He has created us to be

FINAL THOUGHT - Homily 25 on the Gospel of Matthew (Today's Gospel Reading) by St. John Chrysostom

For when (Jesus) had come down from the mountain, there came a leper, saying, Lord, if You will, You can make me clean. Great was the understanding and the faith of him who so drew near. For he did not interrupt the teaching but awaited the proper time, and approaches Him when He had come down. And not at random, but with much earnestness, and at His knees, he beseeches Him, as another evangelist says, and with the genuine faith and right opinion about him. For neither did he say, If You request it of God, nor, If Thou pray, but, If You will, You can make me clean. Nor did he say, Lord, cleanse me, but leaves all to Him, and makes His recovery depend on Him, and testifies that all the authority is His.

The Lord, though He spoke oftentimes many things modestly, and beneath His own glory, what says He here, to establish the doctrine of them that were amazed at Him for His authority? *I will, be thou clean*. Although in the many and great signs which He wrought, He nowhere appears to have uttered this word. Here however, to confirm the surmise both of all the people and of the leper touching His authority, He purposely added, *I will*.

And it was not that He said this, but did it not; but the work also followed immediately. Whereas, if he had not spoken well, but the saying had been a blasphemy, the work ought to have been interrupted. But now nature herself gave way at His command, and that speedily, as was meet, even more speedily than the evangelist has said. For the word, immediately, falls far short of the quickness that there was in the work.

But He did not merely say, I will, be thou clean, but He also put forth His hand, and touched him; a thing especially worthy of inquiry. For wherefore, when cleansing him by will and word, did He add also the touch of His hand? It seems to me, for no other end, but that He might signify by this also, that He is not subject to the law, but is set over it; and that to the clean, henceforth, nothing is unclean. The Lord, to signify that He heals not as a servant, but as absolute master, does also touch. For His hand became not unclean from the leprosy, but the leprous body was rendered clean by His holy hand.

Because, as we know, He came not to heal bodies only, but also to lead the soul unto self-command. As therefore He from that time forward no more forbad to eat with unwashed hands, introducing that excellent law, which relates to the indifference of meats; just so in this case also, to instruct us for the future, that the soul must be our care — that leaving the outward purifications, we must wipe that clean, and dread the leprosy thereof alone, which is sin (for to be a leper is no hindrance to virtue):— He Himself first touches the leper, and no man finds fault. For the tribunal was not corrupt, neither were the spectators under the power of envy. Therefore, so far from blaming, they were on the contrary astonished at the miracle, and yielded thereto: and both for what He said, and for what He did, they adored his uncontrollable power.
