


Seeds of Hope

I hope everyone is enjoying a Christmas season of hope, love, and joy. Throughout the Advent season and in our celebration of Christmas, I have seen the people of our parishes reach out with striking generosity to help one another and help our parishes. The giving has been enormous. Just to name one example, during Advent, each of our parishes in the Harvest of Hope community put up giving trees, with many tags that needed to be taken, representing gifts for people in need – and within the first weeks, we had no tags left. To me, this is an amazing example of goodness. Thank you for making Christmas beautiful in our communities.

Of course, there's no reason our giving should be limited to a few weeks of the year. In fact, wouldn't it be wonderful to experience the joy of giving and of making our world a better place throughout the year? Today I'd like to invite you to consider one way of carrying this spirit of love and giving into the year ahead.

A few years ago, our parishes added an inspiring and needed new ministry called Seeds of Hope. It was a way for us to serve the needs of our surrounding community, far outside the doors of our church buildings, just as the Gospel calls us to clearly do. We started thinking about the ways we could live out the Church's teaching -- what it means to build a good and just society -- in concrete and effective ways. The first Seeds of Hope project was to collect personal hygiene products for our local food shelves. It was a huge success. We also hosted the 2019 Century Farmers Mass with the bishop, held at the Hartung Farm.

Due to a change of staffing, the program was put on hold for a bit. Then when the pandemic hit, it was sidelined for even longer. It's now time to renew our efforts to make Seeds of Hope an important part of our parish life.

Our priests and parish staff are convinced that we should not let the momentum that was begun with Seeds of Hope disappear. It's time to re-engage the program, and we're looking for people who would like to take part. One great thing about a program like this is that it's mostly "behind the scenes," which can make it appealing to some folks who are not so comfortable with ministries that put us in front of large crowds, like an entire Sunday congregation or a religious education classroom. It's rolling up your sleeves, doing things like packing boxes or making deliveries, and engaging with people one-on-one — in ways that make the Gospel more alive in the world!

If you would like to join us in the work of Seeds of Hope, please join us at Seven Dolors Parish on January 27 at 7:00 pm to reorganize and begin talking about the next steps. This invite goes to all parishioners in our Harvest of Hope Catholic Community.

Epiphany Sunday was January 2. This past week our Faith Formation Classes blessed their classrooms, if you have not yet blessed your home, we encourage you to do so.

How do you bless an epiphany door?

Either on Twelfth Night (5 January), the twelfth day of Christmastide and eve of the feast of the Epiphany, or on Epiphany Day (6 January) itself, many Christians (including Anglicans, Lutherans, Methodists, Presbyterians and Roman Catholics, among others) write on their doors with chalk in a pattern such as 20 + C+ M + B + 22. The first initial of the 3 kings that visited Jesus are used. Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar.

As you mark the sign of the cross, utter a simple prayer asking God to bless the room. For example "In the name of Jesus Christ I ask for Your peace and joy to inhabit this room," or "May Your Holy Spirit flow through and fill this home up with Your Spirit."

A PRAYER FOR A NEW YEAR

Sometimes, as the festivities of Christmas are ending and the decorations are coming down, life can feel a little blah. People are going back to their regular work and school routines, making resolutions (and breaking them, in some cases!), and there are still months to go until spring. What are we supposed to do with ourselves if we feel restless in these long months?

One thing that can be helpful is to try out a new prayer practice. I'd like to share one that might be new to you. It can be said sitting down or kneeling, lying in bed or walking, driving or waiting in line. It goes like this:

Be. Be still. Be still and know. Be still and know that I am. Be still and know that I am God. Be still and know that I am. Be still and know. Be still. Be.

I like to take a breath in before each line and then exhale while saying the words of that line. We have used it before bed with our children when they had trouble falling asleep. I find that if I'm feeling anxious, this prayer helps me to re-center and focus. If you decide to try it out, let me know! - Abbey
