#### Reflections on the Readings Theme: Baptism of the Lord

Dearly Beloved in Christ,

A minister was baptizing some new church members. As the first woman came up out of the water, she joyously exclaimed to the congregation, "Bless the Lord, O my Soul." The next new member after his baptism said, "The Lord is my Shepherd." A third one quoted, "Who can separate me from the love of Christ?" And the fourth one, too quoted the Bible and said, "I can do all things through Jesus who strengthens me." The fifth to be baptized was a timid one with little knowledge of the Bible. He was very nervous before the group. As he came out of the water, he gave a wide grin to the congregation and exclaimed, "Merry Christmas, everybody."

Today, we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This feast ends the Christmas season. Jesus emerged from His thirty years of hidden life, and before beginning His public ministry, he got baptized from John the Baptist. Although Jesus is superior to John the Baptist in many ways, He still got baptized from John.

#### Decision that involves renunciation

A time of decision had arrived for Jesus. Like him, all of us must make decisions, and we never have all the information we need to make them. All decisions involve renunciation. If we choose one thing, we thereby reject another. As a result of Jesus' decision to leave home, Mary will be left behind, Jesus will have nowhere to lay his head, the shadow of Calvary will haunt him, and he will have experiences of defeat and outright hostility.

For thirty years, Jesus had faithfully performed his duties to his home and family at Nazareth. There must have been times when he thought about his future ministry and waited for the right moments to begin it.

The event of Baptism by the River Jordan at the hands of John the Baptist was for Jesus Christ his official commissioning. At this event the three persons of the Trinity were present to approve the public ministry of Christ.

In the Gospel account, Luke describes the wonder of the people as they experience John's baptism. Jesus does not need Baptism; in his Baptism he takes upon himself our sins.

Our baptism is a prophetic and royal anointing. We receive the life of the Church and are called to sustain that life. We are special in the sight of God. In fact, his beloved in whom his favor rests.

#### Do you remember the date of your Baptism?

Today's readings reflect on the transforming power of the Spirit and challenge us to release that power for those who are most in need.

Beloved, Baptism brings us together, so let us not allow other sentiments to divide us. May we surrender our soul to Christ, so that the Father may be well pleased with us in Jesus. Shalom!

#### Various gifts

As various reflections came to me this season, I thought it very interesting about the various gifts that were in Nativity scenes.

The Nativity scene in Nepal is a reminder of the often overlooked nomads of history, many of whom traveled in this part of the world. The figures themselves represent beautiful Nepali symbolism. Joseph is depicted with his hands facing outwards towards the Christ-Child—a cultural sign of respect. Three shepherds each hold a different object: a feather, a sword, and a staff. These objects exemplify learning, protection, and hard work, respectively.

In the crèche from Taiwan, the wise men are interpreted to be bearing a ring, a flute, and a piece of fruit to symbolize the marriage (ring) between heaven (flute) and earth (fruit) driven by the Incarnation of Jesus Christ.
