Father Raphael's Reflection

Reflection for the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Theme: When we do what we can, God will do what we cannot.

Dearly Beloved in Christ,

There are tangible signs all around us that enable us to navigate through the hustle and bustle of life. For instance, there are signs of affection from loved ones, tokens of appreciation from the grateful, pats on the back from well-wishers. It is easy to become immune to signs, thus failing to recognize their deeper meaning.

In today's Gospel, we heard about the multiplication of loaves. Jesus, with just five barley loaves and two fish, fed a multitude of five thousand men. Through the multiplication of the loaves and the fish Jesus manifested in the first place that He is concerned about every human need; secondly, that He has the power to satisfy our needs.

Jesus is Concerned About Human Needs

Seeing the multitude coming towards Him, He asked Philip as to where they could buy food for all those people. They had been following Him for days. Looking for rest, both for Himself and His disciples, Jesus got into a boat and went to the other side of the Sea. Then the people who had been following Him made a hasty nine-mile journey on foot to catch up with Him. They were so desperate to find and keep up with Jesus that they had forgotten even to eat. Although they had forgotten to eat their meal, Jesus had not forgotten they were hungry. He noticed their need and began to provide for them.

Jesus has the Power to Satisfy Our Needs

Nothing of our need is too small for Him to neglect us and none of our need is too big for Him to satisfy. Jesus provided a single meal for the multitude and He also calmed a great storm in the sea. Jesus always worked miracles from the raw materials provided by the people. To create new things from nothing would not have been difficult for Him, but that was not the mission He came for. He came not to create new systems, but to recover the lost sheep and to heal the sick at heart.

For Jesus to work a miracle in our lives, we need to provide our share of bread and fish. It may be meager, but it does not matter.

Dearly beloved, Jesus can provide for all our needs. We need to have faith in Him. Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? (Mt. 6:26) Shalom!

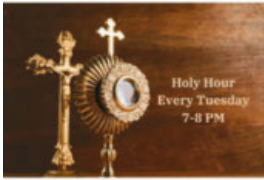

This Montessori approach assists children to cultivate a living relationship with Jesus, through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and to God the Father. 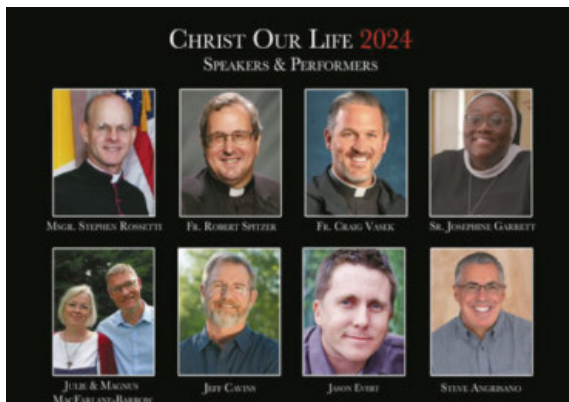
