## THE BANE AND BLESSED

This week our church will get a new paint job. About every 40 years or so we paint the church. And also we plan to do some improvements to the lighting. I think of the story about the church that planned to install chandeliers. A member of the congregation objected. He said, "What we really need is some light."

I am told it is 52 feet to the top of the church ceiling. The hoist will allow the painter to reach the heights while also moving from side to side. Up and down, and all around. The young man who is doing the work is not intimidated by the risk. His only concern is to do the best job possible.

The painter provides a reminder that as disciples of Christ, our desire must be to go higher—in prayer, in Eucharist, in service to others, especially the poor. Mediocrity is the great threat to the Christian life. This far, and no farther. This is good enough. The Lord doesn't call me to be a saint. The temptation to mediocrity is great. If we are not moving forward, we are being lulled backward. Jesus tells us to put out into the deep (Luke 5:4). If we are not putting out into the deep, our mediocrity has trapped us in the shallows. The Christian faith must always be growing, seeking higher and deeper, or it is shrinking and weakening.

It is never too late to grow in faith. A renewed effort at daily prayer, perhaps Mass on a weekday, reading a spiritual book, volunteering to assist those in need. The more we grow, the more we will want to grow. The more we know the Lord, the more we will want to know Him.

This week please pray for the safety of our painters. They take risks but they do so with the desire to do the best work they can. And let's let them inspire us to go higher and deeper for the One we wish to love and serve.
