

THE BANE AND BLESSED



Tom and Mary Pat Roovers live in Wausau. They are good friends whom I have known since serving as pastor at St. Matthew Parish. Years ago they founded the Helping Hands mission to serve the poor in Jamaica and Kenya. In March Tom was in Kenya to prepare for the arrival of volunteers who would construct several homes during their two week stay. This note intrigued me and I share it with you. Tom writes:

An “interesting” experience on Sunday—we were making home visits deep in the bush—on a very desolate dirt/stone road. I saw a huge pothole just ahead and thought I best steer way to my left so I don’t get eaten by that pothole—going too far to my left, I hit some jagged boulders and burst the sidewall of the rear tire.

OK I said to the two Helping Hand volunteers—now you can show me how to change a tire—knowing that they probably had never done so nor seen a car tire changed. We all got out of the car—I went to open the “boot” (trunk) to find and get the spare tire and jack—if they were there! With my head almost inside the boot, I felt a tap on my shoulder—I stood up and turned around—there was a tall young man about 25-30—he said “I will change it for you.” Which he did in about 8 minutes.

When he was finished, we placed the damaged tire in the boot as well as the jack. I took a minute to make sure that all was in place and then turned to say Thanks and pay him for his help. He was gone—keep in mind that we drove up the road and saw no one—there was no one ahead of us when we got the flat—and no houses in this remote area. I asked the two local volunteers where did he come from—and then where did he go—they had no idea—the only answer is that the side of the road with the flat tire was heavily wooded—he must have come out of the bush and returned...the attached picture is of our tire changing Angel.

I have the Angel’s picture on my computer. But I leave it to your imagination as to what he looked like. The Angel may well appear to you so watch every face.

To my mind, he looks a lot like Tom Roovers.
