THE BANE AND BLESSED



Thursdays about 10:15 AM. That is when I would often stop by the second grade classroom at St. Patrick School in Hudson. Mrs. Koss read to second graders about that time each week. She sat in the chair and the children sat at her feet. I don't recall what books she shared with them. I recall only how attentive they were and how excited to hear the story. I interrupted them often but did so because I was so touched by their wonder and eagerness to listen. I can see them still.

There is something wonderful about being read to. We sit down to listen because something important is being said. It happens at each Mass when the Liturgy of the Word begins. The reader proclaims the Scriptures to us, but it is God who speaks. Remember how the Risen Jesus walked with the two disciples on the road to Emmaus and explained how everything that had occurred—his entry into Jerusalem, his dying and rising—all were in fulfillment of the Old Testament. The only way to really understand Jesus is through the Old Testament. In the second reading we sit and listen to the faith handed on by the apostles, usually St. Paul. And when the Gospel is proclaimed we stand to recognize its special importance and priority.

At the Liturgy of the Word we listen to our story of salvation. God speaks now. God had the first word, and will have the last. But he speaks to his people now. Saving history is happening still. This is the greatest story ever told. We don't choose our Savior. If you decide who your Savior is to be, that one cannot save you. At every Mass we sit and listen to God's story. We sit and listen to God's saving story. And we say, "Thanks be to God."




The Rosebud Program

The Elizabeth Ministry program at SEAS introduced a visual reminder of the power of prayer through the Rosebud program. At the front of the church in the sanctuary under our Blessed Mary, you will see a vase of

roses. These roses each represent a sacred life and each color represents a different prayer request. A **pink** rosebud honors pregnancy and the unborn baby. A **red** rosebud celebrates birth or adoption. A **white** rosebud remembers a child lost through miscarriage, abortion, stillbirth, or infant or child death (whether recent or in the past). A **yellow** rosebud represents those waiting to conceive or adopt. A **blue** rosebud represents those families experiencing troubling times, and a **purple** rosebud represents grandparents' concerns.

When the occasion arises, simply approach the altar, pick out the appropriate rosebud, and place it in the vase. A journal is available to fill out with your name or with an anonymous notation whatever details you would like the parish to hold in prayer. Prayer cards for the various situations are located next to the roses and can be taken home and kept for personal meditation. The roses will serve as reminders to all members of the parish to hold your intentions in prayer. If you have any questions, please contact Carol Reider at 608-526-4424.


