## THE BANE AND BLESSED

It is not unusual to see church signs that say “All Are Welcome!” We sometimes sing a hymn proclaiming that fact. But I wonder if it is true. More often than we admit we put conditions on our welcome. You are welcome if....You are welcome when....You are welcome but.... Our welcome quickly wears thin or disappears for the troubled and troublesome, the brash and the braggart, the demanding and the dull.



Schools often proclaim that they enable students to realize their full potential. But we are called to the fullness of life that is more than human potential. We are called to share God’s life. And we share in God’s life through the Resurrection of Christ. “It is no longer I who live but Christ who lives in me,” Paul proclaims. And our sharing in that life begins already. Not another life sometime, somewhere, after the grave. But the fullness of life begins now. We prize our life now because God does. We prize others because God does. We prize others because God loves them equally. God loves me with all his heart but loves you with all his heart as well. And we can praise, rejoice and celebrate our neighbor’s success and abilities and achievements because we are not in competition in the eyes of God.

Too often, I believe, we welcome others because of what they do or have accomplished. Too often we value education because of what it teaches us to do and the job it prepares us for. Often “What do you do?” or “What do plan to do?” is the first question we ask a stranger. To answer: “I say my prayers, love my spouse, cherish my children, practice honesty, tend my garden” may well be true and a better clue to our character and more important in God’s eyes.

And while many people would not answer in such a way, I thank God that our world is full of people who live that way.
