






## Reflections from Fr. Kiefer



### What does a parochial vicar do while the pastor is on sabbatical?

At the end of this month Father Sakowski will be returning from his sabbatical. Here are some of the questions I've been asked during his time on sabbatical:

1. Are you going to have a party at the rectory while Father Sakowski is away? **(Answer:** No. It has been nice celebrating a majority of the weekend Masses for the past few months. It has allowed me to see many of the parishioners on a more regular basis. I have also enjoyed being able to have dinner at several parishioners' homes during this time.)

2. That's a lot of responsibilities with two parishes and being chaplain at Regis. Are you going to be able to handle all of that? **(Answer:** Thanks be to God – I have. God has made it work out. One of the interesting things I noticed early on was that some people assumed that I was going to have all this extra work on my plate while Father Sakowski was away. In one sense, that's true. I have celebrated many of the weekend Masses, heard a majority of the Confessions, and celebrated most of the weddings and funerals. But, the day-to-day operation of the parish has not changed. We still have a phenomenal staff who oversees and carries out our ministry in the areas of evangelization, faith formation, pastoral ministry, music, liturgy, finance, buildings, and grounds. We have a fantastic team of directors and coordinators who keep our parishes not just running, but also thriving. I'm very blessed to work with such an outstanding team of disciples.

3. What are you going to do when Father returns? **(Answer:** Take a nap.)

4. What has it been like for you while Father Sakowski has been on sabbatical? **(Answer:** Ironically, this is not the first time I have served as a parochial vicar while my pastor has gone on a sabbatical. At my last assignment at St. Matthew's Parish in Wausau, Wisconsin, my pastor took a three-month sabbatical toward the beginning of my third year at the parish. For his sabbatical he participated in an eleven-week program called the Institute for Continuing Theological Reflection in Rome in which the priests participating learned about the priesthood through theology, art, culture and travel throughout Italy. At that time, I also was assigned as chaplain to Newman Catholic, the Catholic high school and middle school in Wausau. I really had to balance my time. It was a busy time, but fortunately I was blessed with an excellent staff with whom I worked very well and with parishioners who offered words of support and encouragement. God gave me the grace and energy that I


needed in order to serve well the people of the parish and school. One of the things I learned during that time was that as a priest you do not need to fill every moment of your time at the parish. It is okay and even good to have free evenings with nothing going on. I also learned that it does not matter how much work you do unless you have gotten to know the people at the parish and at the school. I enjoyed that experience very much, and it increased my desire to serve in parish ministry.

When I found out that Fr. Sakowski would be taking a three-month sabbatical this fall, some of the other priests in the Diocese dubbed me the "sabbatical priest," since I again was in a situation where my pastor would be taking a sabbatical. Rather than serving one parish and one HS/MS like before, I have been serving two parishes and a HS/MS over the last couple of months. Fortunately, I have been blessed with a fantastic staff with whom I enjoy working and with kind words of support and encouragement from fellow parishioners. The last few months have been busy, but God has given me the grace and energy that I have needed to serve during this time.

One of the things that I have learned during this time is that no two parish and school assignments are the same. I realized early on that my experience of this "sabbatical coverage" was going to be different than my first "sabbatical coverage." Each parish and school is unique and has its own way of operating. I have also learned the importance of trusting in God and in myself when I have difficult decisions to make. Through prayer and consultation with trusted individuals, certain decisions were easier to make than others and brought a sense of peace, which I would have lacked had I tried to forge ahead by myself. I have enjoyed this experience very much, and it also has increased my desire to serve in parish ministry.

### LIVE THE LITURGY

#### Inspiration for the week

It all really boils down to a matter of the heart, and actions do speak louder than words. We cannot hide from the truth. A problem with religion is that it is possible for someone to make everything appear to be right when actually it is not. We can say all of the right prayers, perform all of the proscribed rituals, claim that we adhere to orthodox doctrines and still lead a distorted, empty and sometimes pitiful life. Only actions springing from true and deep sacrifice demonstrate true integrity. Without sacrifice, even the noblest looking actions can amount to nothing. It is no wonder, then, that the widow who contributed from her poverty received great admiration from Jesus. While it may not always appear to be the case, God has a special care and regard for those who depend upon him in times of trouble and want. Only the person who is truly poor is the only one who can see this. Because of a lack of trust, the one who has much is afraid to take a risk and sees only what they possess as their only security.



### SAINT OF THE WEEK

You may recognize the name St. Frances Xavier Cabrini (1850 – 1917) as the first United States citizen to become a saint. Known for her deep trust in God, she was a courageous woman doing the work of Christ.

Her life of service began when she was first refused admission to the religious order which had educated her to be a teacher. Not one to take things face value, she instead focused her charitable work at the House of Providence Orphanage in Cadogno, Italy, and in 1877, professed vows there and took the religious habit.

When the bishop closed the orphanage in 1880, he named St. Frances Xavier Cabrini prioress of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. However, she had a dream she was determined to fulfill. Since her early childhood, she had dreamed of being a missionary in China. Pope Leo XIII, however, urged her to see the need in the west. She traveled with six of her fellow religious sisters to New York City, where they worked with the thousands of Italian immigrants residing there.

Although she experienced many disappointments during this time, she persevered. When she arrived in New York, the house intended to be her first orphanage in the United States was not available. Rather than come back to Italy and the order she oversaw, she instead found a way to establish that orphanage elsewhere — plus a few more. Throughout her life, she is known for founding 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated, and the sick. She died of malaria in her own Columbus Hospital in Chicago in 1917.
