

Reflections from Jon Jones



Surrendering Our Identity

Last week we saw Jesus baptized and heard God's declaration that Jesus is his "Beloved Son in whom I am well pleased." In the sixth chapter of his letter to the Romans, St. Paul makes a strong argument for our eternal hope based on our union with Christ in

Baptism. "For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his," (v5) he writes. I would like to focus on our union with Christ in baptism not only including our participation in his resurrection, but also Jesus' experience as God's beloved child.

Let's try a thought experiment for a moment. To start, find a quiet space where you know that you will have a few moments to yourself. Stop whatever you're doing and allow yourself a minute to get past the discomfort of simply being. Then, open your heart and courageously ask yourself this question: When God thinks of me, how does he feel?

It's a good question, isn't it? How we react to that question tells us a lot.

It takes bravery to allow ourselves to admit truly what we believe in our hearts about God's impression of us. Perhaps we feel God is disappointed or angry with us. Perhaps we are confused and cannot discern any genuine feeling whatsoever; the dissonance between our brain and our hearts creates a chaotic tangle of questions leaving us helpless. Whatever the case may be, if my experience and yours in this question is not one thing, if it is anything other than this, then there is a problem. What is that one thing, you ask? It is this: the complete, unshakeable trust that when God sees you, his heart swells and a smile comes to his face.

Is that what you thought? Is that what you felt? Is that really true? The Scriptures tell me that God is my Shepherd who restores my soul (Ps. 23), that when I cling to Him in love He will deliver me (Ps 91), that He has called me by name because I am precious in His sight (Isa 43), and that He desires to lift me up as a Father does His child and embrace me, feed me (Hos 11). Twice he speaks from the Heavens declaring Jesus as his beloved son (Lk 3 & 9), therefore, I am his beloved child because

I am in him. When God looks at me and you, this is what He feels toward us.

If I feel anything other than this as my first impulse when I envision God looking at me, then something stands between God and me or distorts my experience of Him. The truth is that over the course of a day I run a gamut of any number of reactions as to what I believe God thinks of me. I might feel His love and support one moment, but quickly I change and believe that He has gotten impatient with me, or that he is disappointed in me right after that. How quickly my heart shifts without me even realizing it!

The implications of this movement are so important because my motivation for serving God and others shift, too. When I can rest in the security of my life being in the palm of his hands and cherished, then I am free to love others and truly give of myself. In that vulnerability God is with me, and even when I experience harsh reactions or hurtful things I know that God is there suffering with me. But, when I live trying to dig out from underneath condemnation, impatience, or some other performance-based attitude, then my interactions are reduced to merely pleasing or taking. I am not free to give of myself and I am still focused on myself rather than on God.

One of my favorite quotes comes from David Benner who writes, "The Father's love reflects the Father's character, not the children's behavior." Our behavior is beside the point. The question is can I trust God's love to be true and unchangeable? Am I willing to admit what stands in the way of my truly receiving his affirmation and give it to him? Am I ready to surrender to such a love? We are just like the prodigal son who gives up his destitute life by remembering that he is his father's son. All we have to do to experience God's overwhelming embrace is surrender to the Father's declaration that we are his beloved children in whom he is well pleased.


