


Reflections from Jon Jones



Last week I was fortunate to attend a training similar to what Fr. Derek has been doing since his Sabbatical last Fall. Learning about the real struggles of addiction of any stripe has had a deep impact on me. I especially have been struck by the long term effects that our relationships have on all of us. Here are some

of my takeaways from last week.

The implications of being made in God's image are radical. Our God is social, having fellowship within himself. We claim this mystery of God's social-oneness every week in the Creed when we profess faith in One God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Because this is a loving fellowship, it grows as it must constantly be giving itself away. So, the inner communion of the Holy Trinity expands, and-ta da!-you and I are created to share in this Trinitarian communion. This means that at our most fundamental level we are social beings, made for relationship as our Creator is relational.

Another way of saying this would be to say that we are built for intimacy. We thrive when we feel close and connected to others. We desire to be heard, seen, understood, chosen, and blessed. But, you might have already noticed that all of those desires must come from someone else. We cannot be at peace if it is only we hearing ourselves. I cannot choose myself. You cannot bless yourself. We are made so that we look to others and find ourselves in the midst of our relationships.

When we are hurt or wounded in our relationships we suffer pain, hurt, or maybe even betrayal. Considering what pain and sin I have suffered at the hands of others, I simply cannot fathom how Jesus felt in comparison. To be arrested, abandoned, beaten, and executed by those he loved so dearly was the ultimate rejection. But, some days I spend time with Jesus in the Church and I ponder. My sufferings and his sufferings. My neighbor's suffering and his. And then I find there is healing in drawing near to him. I experience at the same time both his suffering and my healing. As the Prophet says, "by his wounds, we are healed."

And this is the core of our message, that we serve a God who is no stranger to suffering. Most kingdoms choose a symbol of strength and power to rally around, something that gives people hope that brute strength and willpower bring a brighter future. Instead, we rally around a man pierced and bloody to mourn and pray with him. In this posture of vulnerability, of calmly and shamelessly admitting what we are going through and sharing this space with the Almighty who is also suffering, we begin to abide. Abiding is supernatural intimacy.

Every morning we started our sessions with prayer and scripture. One particular morning I heard the Lord speaking to me through the same words that we pray aloud together this weekend:

"The LORD is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in mercy... He does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities... For he knows our frame; he remembers that we are dust."

God desires intimacy with me. He desires it with you, too. He knows that we sin, but that is not who we are. We are his children who make him smile and whom he desires deeply to raise up and cherish. Who does not want to abide in that kind of intimacy? It is hard for many to believe, I know. So often, though, we reject intimacy with God because we cannot forgive ourselves. But, the faith of a mustard seed can move a mountain of a heart to bring freedom and forgiveness. Whether it is by forgiving yourself or someone else, God invites you into a relationship with him. It is what you and I were created for.

The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or at: on the diocesan website diolc.org/safe-environment/ reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the diocesan website. 
