

Reflections from Fr. Peter Kieffer



What a Difference...

Two years ago I remember attending a state-qualifying basket-ball game, knowing that the brandnew Covid-19 was on its way into the United States. Lent 2020 recently had begun, and there were many unknowns on the horizon.

Due to health concerns surrounding the uncertainty of the virus, the priest with whom I worked at the time decided that it would be best for him to isolate himself out of town for two weeks, hoping that things would sort themselves out by the time that he returned. He trusted that I would handle things at the parish well until he got back.

As we all know, Covid did not sort itself out in two weeks, and I was left at the parish, attempting to figure out how to communicate with the parish at large, without a Communications Coordinator, without a livestream system, and without functioning parish social media.

I remember the first Mass, which I attempted to load to the parish's brand-new YouTube channel. After celebrating the Mass, I remember feeling excited about making Mass available, in some limited capacity, for the parishioners. However, I quickly found out that I had not recorded the Mass properly on my computer. In fact, I had not recorded it at all.

What a difference two years makes. The parish I worked at now has a functioning livestream system, as do our parishes at St. Mary's and St. Raymond's. Our parishes' livestream systems are so well-regarded in the Diocese of La Crosse that we have been asked to livestream a presentation at St. Mary's at 7:00pm on Monday, March 7.

The presentation will be given by Valentyna Pavsyukova. The presentation will be in-person and open to the public, so we hope that you can attend. Valentyna will be speaking about the situation in the Ukraine, as well as the spiritual and humanitarian work of Chalice of Mercy, an organization she helped to found. She will talk about how we can support Chalice of Mercy's mission to the suffering people of her homeland, Ukraine.

While we can reflect on what a difference two years can make for us, the people of Ukraine are acutely aware of what a difference a week can make, and even what a difference a day can make. Many of us has heard stories of the hundreds of thousands of individuals who now find themselves as refugees, unsure of what exactly their future will look like or feel like. For the Christians of Ukraine this likely will be a very difficult Lenten season, one in which they will share deeply in the Cross of Jesus Christ.

While we as a Church continue to pray and to support those who are suffering right now, we, too, find ourselves at the beginning of this season of Lent, one which is marked by being one of change, one of transformation, and one of conversion. The question for us is: how is God calling us to be different after this Lenten season?

Traditionally, the Church has offered us three ways by which we can enter more deeply into conversion during Lent: 1) prayer; 2) fasting; and 3) almsgiving.

By prayer, we do not just repeat words, which we have learned or memorized, but we seek to communicate in a deep and personal way with God. When we pray, we realize that it is not just we who are communicating with God, but that it is also God communicating with us. That can be challenging, because we do not always know what God will place on our hearts, how He will challenge us, or how He will invite us to be different.

By fasting, we seek to deny ourselves of something that keeps us from being the person who God wants us to be. Fasting is not merely giving up something just because it is Lent, only with the intention of picking that thing back up as soon as Easter Season begins. Rather, fasting challenges us to examine what in our lives is holding us back and enslaving us and to decide which steps need to be taken in order to achieve greater freedom and joy.

By almsgiving, we strive to grow in the Christian virtue of charity. We attempt to become not only more generous, but also more trusting in God's goodness. God is good to us and blesses us in many ways. Almsgiving is a way to share God's goodness with others, especially those who are in most of need.

Well, I am grateful that I do not need to livestream Mass anymore from my computer or from my cellphone. Much has changed, and much is different from two years ago. As we begin this Lenten Season, how is God calling us to change? How is God calling us to be different?




