

"A Message from Fr. Anthony Wroblewski

In my almost 27 years of priesthood, technology has really developed at lightning speed. With it have come some great leaps in our ability to communicate, in medical technology, and in so many other areas of our lives. But along with those helps to our society, it has brought great ease in accessing the seedier elements of our world. And there is no place it seems to be more pronounced than in pornography. The statistics of pornography in the United States are staggering. It was reported that in the year 2016, people watched 4.6 billion hours of pornography on one website alone. By the time they are teenagers, 93% of boys and 62% of girls will be exposed to pornography. Additionally, pornography sites receive more traffic than Netflix, Amazon, and Twitter combined; 35% of all internet downloads are pornographic, and at least 30% of all internet traffic is pornographic in nature. Any priest will tell you that covid isn't the only pandemic in this world; we have been dealing with the pandemic of pornography a lot longer.

I say all this not to cause a sense of helplessness, but rather to spark a sense of urgency. We need to tackle these issues head on, one person at a time. A few months ago, we had a presentation at our deanery meeting on a ministry that is specifically Catholic, that has been developed locally, and tackles issues of the problem of pornography and other sexual moral problems of individuals from a spiritual perspective. The ministry is called PULLS. I was recently informed they have a new website at www.pullscatholic.org. The groups have been mostly men's groups, but I understand they are beginning some ministry to women who struggle with these issues.

A little about PULLS: it is a Catholic program with a three-fold purpose: to stop sexual behaviors that contradict our Catholic faith, to reframe sexuality, using the Theology of the Body as their model, and to help others follow their path. This program of sexual healing is based on the 12-step program of Alcoholics Anonymous, a spiritual foundation of recovery, in conjunction with the 7 points of the Kerygma, the foundation of the Christian faith, and the traditions and Biblical teachings of the Catholic Church.

There are of course other programs out there that help people with sexual addictions. But if you have been looking for one that is local and Catholic, you might want to give this one a try. Or perhaps you might know someone that has been looking for help, and can refer them. Either way, I hope you will be praying for an end to two pandemics, one which has been a scourge for decades now.

Faith Formation: Everyone needs help from time to time. Today we hear the story of the Wedding at Cana, which describes the beginning of Jesus' public ministry and his first miracle.

At the Wedding Feast at Cana, Mary observed the needs of the hosts and brought the concern to Jesus, confident that he would respond. Mary brought the need she saw to Jesus because she believed that Jesus could make the situation better. Jesus not only made things better for the hosts at the wedding feast he also used this opportunity to give us a sign as to how extraordinary the kingdom of God is.

Asked to do something to address the awkward situation that the absence of wine at a wedding feast would create, Jesus' miracle produces vast quantities of wine, six jars holding thirty gallons each are filled to overflowing with choice wine. This lavish response to a simple human need is a vision for us of the abundance of God's kingdom.

We believe that the Kingdom of God will be like an extraordinary feast generously prepared for us by God. Using Mary as our model we are invited to participate in this kingdom every day. Following her example, we are encouraged to present our needs to God, confident that He will respond in extraordinary ways.

He shows us today that He will respond to our needs and to the needs of our world in ways that are beyond anything that we can imagine. We just need to continue to hold steadfast when confronted with human need, and to bring our petitions and prayers to Him, confident that He will respond in ways we could only imagine.
