

"A Message from Fr. Anthony Wroblewski

When you are reading this article, I will be preparing to make my yearly retreat. Two years ago, Fr. Seth and I made a retreat at a Carmelite retreat house in California. The sisters that run the place, when priests are on retreat, pray constantly for those priests. I have no doubt that's why the previous retreat we made there was so powerful. So two years ago, we already had reserved our rooms and vowed to return.

As you are aware, every priest is required by Church Law to make an annual retreat. It is that important that the Church demands that of its clergy. I have heard it said, and can testify to the truth of it from my own experience, that when a person makes a retreat, it will take at least two or even three days for a person's mind to calm down enough so that good prayer and mediation actually begins taking place. In a recent homily I have, I had said that listening to God was terribly important. Well, we need to calm our minds if we are to be attentive enough to hear the Lords voice within the depth of our souls. We live in a noisy, fast paced world. So we need times when we so focus our minds and bodies in prayer that finally we are attentive enough to hear the voice of God. I do ask you to pray for me this week, as I will undoubtedly be praying for you, my dear parishioners.

Finally, I thought this may be a good time to remind you that we **WILL** be having a mission this year! Fr. Louis Studer, the Provincial of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, and a very good friend of mine, will be here to preach that mission at the very beginning of April.

Perhaps you might now start thinking about making that a kind of retreat for yourself. Maybe take a day or two off of work. Decide you will spend some significant time in prayer that week, either here at the Cathedral or at home. Take time to be renewed and rejuvenated in your Catholic Faith. May God Bless you this week, and may we hold each other in prayer.

Faith Formation: We hear in the Gospel today, Jesus challenging the people of Nazareth to respond to him differently from the way others had responded to the prophets. Hearing this message may remind us that it is often difficult for us to hear a challenging message from those who know us best, even if it is true. Sometimes we can be like the people of Nazareth; we don't want to do what Jesus says and trust His message because we find his words challenging. Through our faith we have learned to trust these words. They are the voice of experience, an expert's words, and the words of a trusted friend, Our Saviour Jesus Christ. Looking back to your childhood, perhaps you remember and even regret overlooking the wisdom and guidance of your parents or close relatives. Perhaps you allowed the voices of others to influence decisions in your life. This may be an unavoidable stage in childhood development, but not one that we cannot work to overcome.

Our children also look for guidance from coaches, teachers and friends. It is our challenge and calling as parents to help them realize the need to put more weight on the message of Jesus than any other influential person in their lives. Through the Gospel and Church teachings we hear the message of Jesus and how he wants us to live our lives. Challenge your children to use theses message from Jesus in their decision-making process every day.

Jesus is our greatest teacher, let us pray that we will allow His words to influence us in every decision and aspect of our lives.
