



Faith Formation: We are to treat others as we want to be treated.

In today's Gospel reading, this is how Jesus describes how we are to act toward one another, often referred to as the "Golden Rule". We follow Jesus' command when we love and forgive all people, even when it's hard.

Teaching children at a young age to treat others as they want to be treated supports them in developing traits such as generosity, empathy, and compassion. Traits such as these, will greatly benefit them in living their life in a merciful way.

Our children today face significant moral challenges. As they face these challenges, we can support them by reminding them about mercy, a primary quality that God gives us. We can also help them understand that our call to be merciful, as God is merciful, is a call to act in ways that exceed expectations. They are the good moral choices that go above and beyond what we need to do. Facing moral challenges most likely occur on a daily basis for our children. They can happen at school when their friends are being teased by other classmates or a friend wants to see the answers on their paper. They even face them at home when they may be asked to help watch their siblings or to help with chores. Jesus describes many opportunities that will arise in our lives when we will be faced with having to make good moral choices. The moral choices that Jesus describes, however, sound like they might be difficult to choose. Which is true, some of the choices in our lives will be hard to make and sometimes when we make a choice, things won't turn out how we hoped. We may even wish we could go back and make a different one. It is not uncommon to wish for another chance when facing the decisions, we must make each day. In these instances, it is important to remember that God doesn't just forgive us one time. God forgives us over and over again. God doesn't show love to us just one time; God shows us love all the time. God goes the extra mile for us, just as we are to go the extra mile for others and show them the mercy God shows us every single day.
