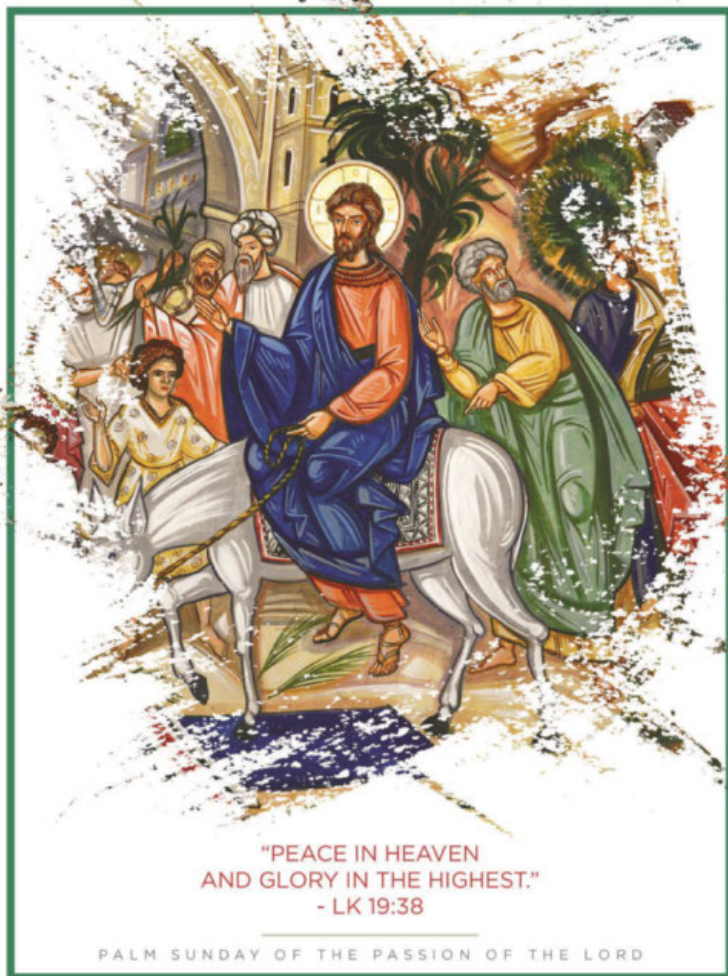

## "A Message from Fr. Anthony Wroblewski"

Two years ago, this is what I wrote in my Palm Sunday Bulletin article: "Well it's Palm Sunday weekend, and normally we would be getting ready for large crowds at Holy Week. But as you know, we are in the midst of this Pandemic, and so we can only connect with you by electronic means, such as our website, Facebook, livestreaming and podcasts." How I detested not being able to celebrate the Holy Week Liturgies with my parishioners. But this year we are doubly blessed: not only are we able to celebrate Holy Week Liturgies with all of you live, but we have a bishop again who will be able to celebrate the liturgies with his people, in his own Cathedral. What a blessing it is!

For many years now, I have been encouraging my parishioners to attend as many Holy Week Masses and services as possible. Having lived through two years of a pandemic that I never expected to last this long, I can truly invite you back to pray together as a Catholic Community! Given this incredible double blessing this year, I do have a similar request of you this year. Make this week, as much as you can, a kind of retreat experience. We had a great Mission with Fr. Studer, which he called a kind of retreat experience. Well, continue that prayerful attitude! This weekend of Palm Sunday, we hear the words: "Today we gather together to herald with the whole Church the beginning of the celebration of our Lord's Paschal Mystery, that is to say, of his Passion and Resurrection. For it was to accomplish this mystery that he entered his own city of Jerusalem. Therefore, with all faith and devotion, let us commemorate the Lord's entry into the city for our salvation, following in his footsteps, so that, being made by his grace partakers of the Cross, we may have a share also in his Resurrection and in his life."

This week, we are not just to recall the great events of our salvation, but also to live them again, and put our lives on the line for Christ, just as He did for us. But how can we unless we make time for Christ in this sacred week? So I urge you to take the time this week to enter into a sort of retreat experience. Take time each day to pray additionally. On Holy Thursday, pray with the Lord in the Garden of Gethsemane. Take time on Friday to pray with Him as He dies on the cross for you. Experience incredible music on Good Friday evening when we once again celebrate a Tenebrae Service. And celebrate His Resurrection on Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday. As we hopefully pray that we may be coming out of this crisis which we have lived, make this week holy!

**Cathedral Tenebrae Service:** Good Friday, April 15 at 7 PM, you are invited to the Cathedral of Our Lady for a Tenebrae Service. The Tenebrae is an evening of solemn readings and music offered but the Cathedral musicians that tell us of the Lord's suffering and death. The service will both be in person and livestreamed on our Cathedral YouTube channel.

**Faith Formation:** Today, Palm Sunday, also called Passion Sunday, marks the beginning of Holy Week. During this, the holiest week in the church year, we prepare ourselves for Easter by prayerful reflecting upon the events of Jesus' passion and death.

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus is portrayed as active and vocal throughout his passion. Only Luke reports Jesus' words of forgiveness spoken from the cross. And only Luke reports the dialogue between Jesus and the good thief. From the cross, Jesus speaks words of forgiveness and promises to the good thief that he will be with him in paradise. Jesus' words were addressed to the good thief, but these words are also spoken to us. If we have faith in Jesus and follow his way of love, we will also be with him in paradise.

If we look more closely at the last words Jesus' spoke from the Cross in today's Gospel, we will see that they are consistent with his whole life. All the work he did and all the words he taught. He is also giving those words to us, that we too need to give our lives into God's hands and we too need to pray to be able to forgive those who do us harm, just as Jesus did.

As we enter into Holy Week, take time as a family and reflect on the events talked about in today's Gospel. Doing so may help your children understand a little better the events that took place, as this Gospel reading can be a little complex for some to understand on their own. Encourage them to ask questions and respond to the events that took place. Helping them to understand that even in his suffering and Death, Jesus shows us his way of love and brought to fulfillment the Kingdom of God. God Bless, Sonya
