

"A Message from Fr. Anthony Wroblewski

Today, rather than writing on one particular topic, I would like to do a "catch all" article on a variety of subjects. First, I want to thank you all for once again being so generous with your UCA contributions! We will always have a responsibility towards the Diocese and its ministries, so I thank you very much for giving what you did in what is still a tough economy, with inflation still not letting up much. Our parishes made their goals before Christmas! I think it would be helpful to remember that you can still continue to give to UCA even now, at the beginning of the year. We will continue to place your gifts in reserve until we get our goal amounts in May. Maybe if we front load our contributions, we won't have to do so much "back-loading" with second collections at the end of the year. Though we will still be doing first weekend second collections as a reminder that we have this obligation.

Secondly, I want to thank you for your generosity in this past Christmas Season! Thank you for your cards, gifts, goodies and wellwishes! Know that I am finally feeling like I am home once again here in Duluth, and it's you who make it feel that way. Again thanks!

Lastly, as we begin a New Year, I would ask you to consider what you might do differently or additionally to enhance your own faith life this year? It is a time of new beginnings. As you read the bishop's pastoral letter, I hope you will see that he is wanting us to fully focus in on our mission of evangelizing the whole of the northeast of Minnesota. I have found that with a strong faith life, there is nothing that I cannot handle. We have so many opportunities in all of our parishes to learn more about your Catholic Faith, and to worship the Lord. Will this year be the time that you might start going to Daily Mass? Will you fully give of yourself to the mobilization to mission that the bishop speaks about? What will you do for yourself and your faith in 2023?

Faith Formation: Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary the Holy Mother of God.

In the Gospel today we hear about the shepherds who

act upon the message they receive from the angel and go to find Jesus in the manger in Bethlehem. In their visit to the manger, the shepherds find things just as the angel had told them. They find Mary and Joseph, and the infant lying in the manger. The shepherds' visit is a moment of fulfillment, and the beginning of the salvation we receive through Christ, but the Gospel also turns our focus to Mary as the Mother of God. Because of Mary's faithfulness to God, she was able to receive the gift of God's Son and accept her role in God's plan for salvation. Mary followed God's directions even though she was not sure what more was to come, she simply obeyed. By doing so, she models for us the path of discipleship and is called Mother of the Church. When we obey God, as Mary did, we also show our-

are obedient to God and His will. As we enter into the last week of the Christmas season, let us reflect upon ourselves as Disciples of Jesus. May we turn to Mary, to help us grow closer to her son, and to show ourselves to be good disciples of him.
