

"A Message from Fr. Anthony Wroblewski

Epiphany, which we celebrate this weekend, marks the occasion of a long-time Christian tradition of chalking the doors. The formula for the ritual is simple: take chalk and write the following above the entrance of your home: 20 + C + B + M + 23. The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi who came to visit Jesus in His first home: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase: Christus mansionem benedicat, meaning "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "23" at the end mark the year. Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless those homes so marked and that He stay with those who dwell therein throughout the entire year.

The chalking of the doors is a centuries-old practice throughout the world, though it appears to be someone less well-known in the United Sates. It is, however, an easy tradition to adopt, and a great practice whereby we dedicate our year to God from its very outset, asking His blessing on our homes and on all who live, work or visit them there. Most often the chalking takes place after Epiphany Mass, and can be done at any home. Traditionally the blessing is done by either a priest or the head of the household. This blessing can be performed simply by just writing the inscription and offering a short prayer, or more elaborately, including songs, prayers, processions, and the sprinkling of holy water.

After many Epiphany Masses, satchels of blessed chalk are distributed. These can then be brought home and used to perform the ritual. This year, the Knights of Columbus are providing us with the chalk you can use for your own blessing of your home.

Practicing traditions like the chalking of the doors helps us to live our Faith more concretely and serve as an outward sign of our dedication to Our Lord. Our homes are also the place where many of us will make the greatest strides in our spiritual growth, through observance of daily prayer, spiritual reading, and work offered as an oblation to God. The chalking of the doors of a home encourages Christians to dedicate their life at home to God and to others. Seeing the symbols over our doors can help to remind us, while passing in and out on our daily routines, that our homes and all those who dwell there belong to Christ. It also serves as a reminder of welcoming the Magi gave to Jesus. We should strive to be as welcoming to all who come to our homes to visit us!

Faith Formation: Happy Epiphany!

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. In Matthew's Gospel reading today, we hear the story of the Magi and their journey from afar to honor baby Jesus with gifts. Matthew's Gospel tells a little different version of the birth of Jesus than in Luke's Gospel, and is the only Gospel that we hear about the visit of the Magi.

Very little is known about the Magi, but we do know that they came from the East, journeyed to Bethlehem with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. The gifts of the Magi—gold, frankincense, and myrrh—have come to be understood as symbols of Christ's royalty, divinity, and eventual suffering and death. This symbolism is very special because in giving these gifts, the Magi acknowledge who Jesus was to be, our Savior.

On the feast of the Epiphany, we celebrate the revealing of Jesus' true identity as the Messiah. Like the Magi, we too search for Jesus and when he is revealed to us, we respond by offering gifts. We offer those gifts that are most valuable to us, and to Jesus. Gifts that show we recognize who Jesus truly is. These gifts are not just things. We can give actions and words that show our love for God and for other people.

As our Christmas season comes to an end. Let us pray that we will continue to acknowledge Jesus as Savior in all that we say and do.

Let us also give thanks for the gift of Jesus and for the Magi, who recognized that Jesus was our Lord and Savior.
