

"A Message from Fr. Trevor Peterson

As I write this article, the Holy Innocents Adoration Chapel has been open for three weeks and it seems things are running smoothly. What a beautiful witness to see Catholics throughout the city coming together in adoration, adoring our Lord Jesus who is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. All of us here at the Cathedral, Saint Mary Star of the Sea, and the adoration chapel team want to extend our appreciation to those who signed up to be either a scheduled adorer or a substitute. Although adoration is a beautiful time, it can also be a struggle and I would like to briefly write about a couple of common struggles that can surface when either thinking about signing up or during adoration itself.

The first common struggle is commitment. We live in a society that is very busy and active and most of us get caught up in the messiness of life. Maybe it is driving kids to sports or school, maybe you have a newborn child and need to spend most of your time and energy for that child, or maybe a person does not have the mobility to get around the city as he or she did long ago. We can also become overwhelmed and stressed. We will have good and bad times but when we take time on a daily basis to visit our Lord either in adoration or in silence at our homes, we are able to connect with Jesus who gives us the strength and healing in order to live out our vocation. Commitments help us to keep on track, especially when it comes to adoration. A commitment holds each of us accountable. Perhaps when scheduling other events, we could schedule them around our time with God.

A second common struggle arises when we have a good routine down and are at adoration, but we begin to notice that our minds go all over the place, especially thinking about the next thing on our schedule, or about some other worry. What do we do about this? We need to remember that we go to adoration to adore our Lord, to give praise and thanksgiving for all the gifts he has given us. Another healthy thing to do while at adoration is after our initial praising God, we can either pray and meditate on the Rosary or a biblical passage, or sometimes God just wants us to be sitting in His presence without saying anything, only to rest in the presence of our Lord.

I hope that if you are not yet one of the adorers, you will prayerfully consider signing up for a weekly time. I know that my life turned around for the better ever since I began adoration over ten years ago, and I do believe each of you will feel a great change in your daily life. In today's Gospel we hear that when Jesus began teaching, some people thought that he had come to abolish the Law of Moses that the Jewish people had been following for centuries. Jesus tells them that he has come, not to abolish the Law, but to fulfill it.

Jesus points out that the Law requires people to do the minimum, but that we also fulfill the Law by going beyond the minimum requirements and responding with love in all that we do. He challenges us to go a step further than the minimum. Jesus tells us that "you shall not kill" is the minimum requirement of the Law, but to refrain from anger that is directed towards anyone is the one step further we need to take.

God's Law of love can be thought of as rules that we are to follow in order to show our love and respect for one another. Without rules, life would be chaos. We as families also have rules. We have rules for eating, rules for how to speak to one another, rules for going out with friends, and so on. Families follow rules as a way of showing love and respect for one another and our children follow the example we set.

The best way to understand God's Law of love and to follow it, is to listen to Jesus Christ himself and to live as he taught us.
