

"A Message from Fr. Anthony Wroblewski

When you go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation this Lent, you will begin hearing two subtle changes in the wording of the prayer of absolution in which the priest forgives your sins. The new prayer was able to be used beginning on Ash Wednesday, and must be used beginning on Divine Mercy Sunday. Here's the new approved text:

God, the Father of mercies,

through the Death and Resurrection of his Son

has reconciled the world to himself

and poured out the Holy Spirit ("among us" was removed) for the forgiveness of sins;

through the ministry of the Church may God grant you pardon and peace,

and I absolve you from your sins

in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Vatican's Dicastery for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments approved the translation in April 2022. To be sure, this latest formula of absolution is not a new prayer. Rather, the translation will be different in a couple of places. And the essential words of sacramental absolution, "I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, (+) and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," will remain unchanged.

These updates are part of a broader effort by the Vatican to ensure accuracy in the translation of liturgical texts from Latin to the vernacular. Liturgical texts have been revised throughout church history under papal direction. The Holy See instructed the bishops of the world at the beginning of the 21st century that our translations needed to be more accurate. The 2001 document "Liturgiam authenenticam," developed the scope of the project, which first resulted in the 2011 full retranslation of the Roman Missal. Since then, we've dutifully been going through the books one by one and preparing new editions of these books.

If, once the new translation goes into effect, a priest would revert back to "sent" and "give" instead of "poured out" and "grant," then the absolution will still be valid. In this case, the penitent may rest assured. As someone who regularly hears confessions and goes to confession as a sinner, I think that the advent of this new translation will be valuable to both confessors and penitents. Confession is generally the only sacrament in which a priest often doesn't use the Ritual book, with the various formulae and prayers for each sacrament, because he has memorized the formula of absolution and many of the other prayers used in this sacrament since he uses them repeatedly. This will allow us to savor anew this pledge of Christ's merciful forgiveness offered to us, no matter the kinds of our sins and how many times we committed them. How grateful we are to go to confession and to have our sins absolved. Jesus Christ has provided for us this way to salvation.

Faith Formation: In today's Gospel we hear the events that took place at the Transfiguration of Jesus. Jesus took Peter, James, and John to a mountaintop. Jesus' appearance was changed, and Moses and Elijah appeared. God's voice spoke from a cloud, saying that Jesus was God's own Son. And only after Jesus' Resurrection from the dead would the disciples fully understand what they had observed on the mountain. When Moses and Elijah appeared next to Jesus at the Transfiguration, the message was clear: Jesus represents what Moses and Elijah stand for: the Law (Moses) and the Prophets (Elijah) and together with Jesus they represent God's complete word. This Gospel reminds us that Jesus is no ordinary person and that his message is not ordinary either. We are reminded to pay close attention to the teachings of Jesus because he represents God's complete Word.

It also tells the story of a great moment in Jesus' life and the lives of his closest disciples. Peter, James, and John are among the first whom Jesus calls to be his Disciples and often referred to as his "inner circle." The Transfiguration occurs in the presence of just these three and may have been an event from which Peter, James, and John drew courage from when faced with the difficult events of Jesus' Passion.

In our lives we also experience highs and lows. Just as Peter, James, and John may have drawn courage from this high point in their lives we too are called to reflect and draw strength from the good times in our lives. Take time this Lent to say a prayer of thanksgiving for the good times and experiences that you have had in your life. Pray that you will use these experiences to sustain you through the difficult times.
