





# Saint of the Week

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."

Where do you get the energy and the strength to go forward in life? It is sometimes hard to accept that we are both sinners AND loved by God. Jesus paid the price for our sins. We are also loved. I encourage you to accept the truth of who you are, receive the truth of who you are, be renewed today by the truth of who you are because this voice from heaven, "This is my beloved Son, listen to him" is not just meant for Jesus. This voice is meant for the crowds and then for you and

for us. If Jesus is in the water it is to cleanse the water for us. After we are baptized, we become this new creation. We become his sons and daughters. Jesus is getting into the water with sinners, you and me. He is not avoiding us but rubbing shoulder to shoulder with us.

We are all reminded that go to the foundation go back to YOUR own baptism, who we really are, Jesus says to each of you, "here is my beloved son, YOU! "Here is my beloved daughter, YOU! This is the ultimate word. Where do you get the energy to do what you need to do? Where do you get your self-esteem and your identity which is the foundation of the person? How do you get filled up? Remember who are in Christ: a beloved son or daughter.

People can say what they want about our behavior good and bad, our characteristics and personality but don't get sucked in. Perhaps you have heard that you are not wanted, a failure, a mistake, lost cause or whatever. So positive is this truth: the Father is well pleased with his son and with his daughter, his own We need to remember that Jesus loves us. Do you know the date you were baptized? Celebrate the day you were made a new creation: a beloved son or daughter of God!

# The Light of the Moon

If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life."

If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows the life of George Bailey from childhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance by the light of the moon?"

That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift.
