

If you are reading this article, you are a member of one of the two groups. The first group has grown up with the technologies that exist today. Computers, smart phones, the internet, streaming videos, and all that they entail are part of life. The second group lived and remember life before these technologies. They readily remind others of what life used to be like. I belong to the second group.

Before smart phones there were just phones. Subscribers had a choice of one-color, black. The most difficult decision was whether one wanted a long cord or short cord on their phone. What is more, unlike today the only thing one could use a telephone for was to make a telephone call.

Today there exists the smart phone. It can do many things. It can get directions, provide instant weather , answer all trivia questions, take pictures, and send and receive them. The list goes on and on. Oh yes it makes phone calls too.

Then there is television. Early TVs were mostly furniture with a picture tube. There were only 4 channels to watch, and about midnight the stations went off the air. Color TV was a marvelous invention that emerged later in life.

Today televisions can be as large as small movie theaters. The picture quality is fantastic. One can see every blemish on the newscaster's face. Cable, satellite, and streaming provide multiple sources of receiving the TV signal. Even the free over the air channels have multiplied to around 20.

Many other changes we have seen in life. I could site more examples. I take mercy knowing that all who have a chance to tell their stories certainly do.

There is one thing in life that has never changed. In a simple word...God! Forever, God has created each one in His image and likeness. He has created each of us to share His limitless love. He wants for us not to be sinners, but because of our free will he knows we are sinners. His forgiveness knows no bounds He has given us His Son, to remind us of His love, to teach us how to live and a promise of eternal salvation. God always has and always will love each of us. There are no exceptions.

Excerpts from Fr. Albert's Christmas Greeting

I want to bring you up to speed with what we have collectively achieved in the past years for the many, many children, young people and families in Ghana. On December 1, 2021, I will turn 9 years as a priest. For these past years we have together brought joy and relief to many children and families in Ghana. Your financial support has put me in the position to be able reach out to those who need me in the missions and in the communities around. Together, we have supported 230 children and young people within this period to pay their school fees; we provided school supplies such as bicycles, stationeries, desks, clothing, as well as medical care.

- 1. 10 students have graduated and are now nurses
- 2. 2. 6 students have graduated and are now teachers
- 3. 3. 30 students in a senior high school have their rent being paid for and some amount of food supplied to them.
- 4. 4. 184 children and youngsters at different levels of education are receiving educational support in accordance with their need.

In addition to these, we have built a grade school from 1st to 6th grade and provided desks for the children. We are adding three more classrooms to take it to the 9th grade. The following projects carried out.

- 1. A Clinic is built (it is operational)
- 2. We drilled 9 wells around the communities for clean water
- 3. We fixed a Marian Shrine and built and new one
- 4. We built a church for one of the mission stations (furnishing is yet to be done)
- 5. We built a youth center for Youth Faith Formation
- 6. We provided church goods for the churches and missions

As I thank the Lord for His act of salvation, I want to express my gratitude to you for saying Yes to Jesus in supporting my mission – The people can now have access to nearby and quality health care, have clean water to drink and many children now are in school.
