

Pastor's Letter

BAPTISM AS THE FOUNDATION

Jesus taught about the need to build our lives on the solid foundation of faith, centered in Him (see Matthew 7:24). While the necessary foundation itself for such building is solid and immoveable, what is build on that foundation is always growing, always developing. Today's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord reminds us of our own baptismal dignity and our calling to grow spiritually and to mature as authentic disciples of the Lord Jesus.

One of the most important considerations of that fact is often misunderstood or altogether neglected, and that is that Baptism is the foundation of all we do as Christians: whatever good we do in this world merits in God's sight only in virtue of our Baptism; we grow in God's grace and in true knowledge of God only in virtue of our Baptism; we have hope of, and can strive for eternal life only in virtue of our Baptism; we reflect God's presence, compassion, mercy and universal love to those around us only in virtue of our Baptism.

God has called, but it is up to us to respond; God has taken the initiative, it is up to us to correspond to it; God has planted in us the seed of eternal life, it is up to us to nurture it, God has shown us the path and opened it up to us, but we must be the ones to walk in it.

As we continue our spiritual journey of growth through this still new Liturgical Cycle of the Church, this Year of Grace, I encourage you to focus on your own Baptism and how important it should be in your life. You may want to begin commemorating the day you were baptized each year, as you do your birthday or other anniversary. Above all, however, be thankful often to God who has called you to eternal life in His Son, Jesus Christ, through the purifying and life-giving waters of Baptism, and follow the exhortation of St. Paul "to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all lowliness and meekness, with patience, forbearing one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of us all, who is above all and through all and in all. (Ephesians 4:1-6).

SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, 2ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

Isaiah 62:1-5 The primordial human institution of marriage was willed by God in creating humanity to serve as a symbol of the special and privileged relationship God wills to have with his People as their God, and with every Christian soul: unique, exclusive, and enduring.

I Corinthians 12:4-11 "One and the same Spirit" is at the origin of every good gift we possess, the ordinary no less than the extraordinary, all of them intended "for some benefit" among the community of the Church.

St. John 2:1-11 Just as Jesus turned water into wine, God has taken something good and elevated it to something better in elevating the natural institution of marriage to a Sacrament, a sign of the very love of God for his people.
