

Pastor's Letter

THE CONTINUING RELEVENCE OF THE SECOND VATICAN COUNCIL

I am leading a series of *Surveys* on Thursday evenings as part of an ongoing Adult Faith Enrichment Series that began last December and is planned to run through April of this year. The current *Survey* deals with the sixteen documents issuing from the Second Vatican Council, 1963-65. I'd like to share with all of you some thoughts on that topic since that Council has impacted us all and given the entire Catholic Church the direction and trajectory we are currently on and will be for the foreseeable future as disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ and members of his Mystical Body, the Church.

The Church's Bishops who gathered in Council decided at that time that certain changes in the Church's life were called for in order to make more clear to the people of our age, in the first place the Catholic faithful ourselves, the meaning of the Church and of the divine message and mission entrusted to her by our Lord Jesus Christ. Changes were made in every area of Catholic life, practice, and discipline. Most of what changed went largely unnoticed by the rank-and-file Catholic because it dealt with clergy formation and discipline, canon law, the Religious life, and the Breviary, today called the "Liturgy of the Hours." One area of change that did catch everyone's attention was the liturgy of the Mass and changes in the layout of the Sanctuary, together with the opportunity for a broader participation by the laity, not only in the Mass, but in every other aspect of the Church's life, mission and ministry.

Each change that was eventually made was, we must believe, intended to bring that area of Church life more into line with the stated "spirit" of the intended reforms, that is, to create a more authentic reflection of the Gospel to believers and nonbelievers alike, and to highlight the Church's universal call to the holiness of all its members. There have been problems resulting from a lack of to clarifications or the timely and effective correction of excesses, misdirected efforts, and sadly, at times also of misplaced expectations.

Still, Vatican II was an authentic act of the Church's divinely-instituted *Magisterium*, and as such provides us with inspiration and basic guidance based on the Gospel as to how to live and engage with each other and with the world as a community of faith and as individual believers. In a word, the Second Vatican Council was the Church defining herself, - her identity and mission - for our age.

I Corinthians 12:31-13:13 St. Paul provides us with the demanding, lofty standard of the true follower of Jesus Christ, that is, to strive to achieve in our very being the perfection of love.

St. Luke 4:21-30 What God asks of us can at times be surprising and challenging to our way of seeing, understanding, and judging things in our life. A deep and personal faith alone can allow us to accept what the mind cannot fully understand.


