

Pastor's Letter

FEAST DAY OF THE BISHOP AND MARTYR, ST. VALENTINE (*Mon., Feb 14*)

Together with All-Hallows Eve, the Birth of Christ and the Resurrection of the Lord, St. Valentine's feast day is yet another Christian Holy Day that has been hijacked by secular culture and made a mere "holiday," just another excuse for a meaningless party. From days given us to strengthen our faith, inspire our action, and provide depth and meaning to our Christian lives, these celebrations have been turned into trite, self-serving occasions for childish and often irresponsible self-indulgence.

St. Valentine was a Bishop during one of the many Roman persecutions of Christians in the first centuries of our Era. He had defied a ban by the Emperor on celebrating marriages, was arrested and subsequently martyred. His defense of the natural right to marry, and his willingness to expose himself to death for the sake of the *Sacrament of Christian Marriage* has made him an authentic icon of true love: love of God and neighbor, love of faith, and of Christian life and virtue.

All of that has been degenerated by contemporary culture - or real lack of culture - into an occasion to "celebrate" sinful relationships heterosexual or homosexual, hedonistic indulgence, vice and infidelity, and the idolization of superficial puppy-love masquerading as that love which is intended by God to ennoble and to elevate the human person, to enrich and to enliven human existence and the beautiful relationship meant by the Creator to bond a man and a woman in fruitful union of body and soul for life. Christian Marriage, that is the marriage of Christians as a Sacrament, is intended by God to be a visible sign of God's own love for the Church and of the Church for the Lord, and, so, a sign to the world of God's loving plan for humanity.

Are we Christians partially to blame for this cultural confusion and skewing of the understanding of love? There's absolutely nothing wrong with romantic love. It's even necessary to "keep the fire alive" in a relationship, but that's in a healthy and normal relationship as God intended it, and not as a cheap substitute for one. So, let the roses express your love based on faith and respect, and let the chocolates represent your commitment and the standard of virtue on the part of both of you needed to bond your marriage unbreakably together.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, 7TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

I Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23 David could have taken his personal revenge on King Saul, but realized that God alone has the right to judge and to mete out justice. For this, David would remain at true peace both with God and with himself.

I Corinthians 15:45-49 Nature has determined the mode of our present life, our brief sojourn in this world with all of its limitations and its challenges. Jesus Christ is the pattern we are offered for the promise of eternal life, one that begins in this world with our necessary cooperation, but will come to its fullness only in the next.

St. Luke 6:27-38 The Lord Jesus isn't teaching us here to let ourselves become doormats. Rather, his teaching is focused on our learning both to leave *judgment* in God's hands who alone knows our heart and the full circumstances of our life. This will set the criterion of our own judgment one day by God.

We ask you to pray the Synod prayer daily (provided below) and a Novena to the Holy Spirit February 18-26

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts: Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful: do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You. who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son. forever and ever. Amen.
