Pastor's Letter

MOTHERS, AND THE MOTHERHOOD OF GOD

As we celebrate Mothers and their special Day this weekend, I thought it might be a good idea to put motherhood in its broader perspective, that of imaging to us the "Motherhood" of God, or those qualities that we naturally associate with motherhood as they are found in God.

Although created in God's own image and likeness, no one human person can adequately or sufficiently reflect that image. That is why "God created them male and female" (*Genesis 1:27*). I often remind couples about this during their wedding: they are called to more perfectly manifest that fuller and more complete image of God to one another and to the world *as a married couple*: the loving and lifegiving nature of the Trinity itself (*see I John 4:8; John 1:3*).

So, on this Mothers' Day I wanted to share these thoughts with you. God is manifest in all of creation: "Ever since the creation of the world his invisible nature, namely, his eternal power and deity, has been clearly perceived in the things that have been made" (*Romans 1:20*). In a mothers love for her children can be seen a reflection of God's love for each and every one of us: unconditional, ever-ready, forgiving, compassionate, empathetic, encouraging, protective, tender, present even when we are not, as God speaks to us through the Prophet Isaiah: "Can a woman forget her sucking child, that she should have no compassion on the son of her womb? Even these may forget, yet I will not forget you. Behold, I have graven you on the palms of my hands" (*Isaiah 49:15-16*).

As you celebrate, thank and show your mothers your love and appreciation today - and every day - consider that she is there to lead you through her own motherly love to understand better God's love for you. In this, she has led you to find God more clearly in your life.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, 5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER:

Acts 14:21-27 This apostolic encouragement to perseverance in the faith is as valid and as timely today as it was two thousand years ago. Not only hardships, but also neglect can seriously erode and compromise the power of faith.

Revelation 21:1-5a God, who first created all that exists has, in the resurrection of Jesus Christ, begun to "make all things new" in him.

St. John 13:31-33a, 34-35 Love of one another after the example of Jesus himself is to be the hallmark of the followers of Jesus Christ, and the cause of faith in those who witness it, as well as the glorifying of God through it.



During the season of Easter, what a great time to remember our mothers and ask for God's blessing on them. It is God who ultimately gave us life. It is through God's unselfish love--mirrored in our mothers' willingness to associate their love with God's and take the risk to love us into life--that we have the opportunity for life. We remember our mothers this Mother's Day with much love. Let us pray for each of them:

God our heavenly Father,

you give to each the ability to share your generative love.
Bless those women in our lives who mirror your love and bring forth life through their willingness to risk bringing new life into this world.
Help us to show them our gratitude for the gift of life and the gift of a mother's love. May our life-giving God continue to bless them and show them his unfailing love. We ask this through Jesus, God's Son and our brother.

PARKING RESTRICTION


