Who is my neighbor?

Over Pentecost weekend last month, myself and two other parishioners attended the Synod Assembly at Holy Spirit Church and Cretin-Derham Hall High School. Over the course of that weekend, one of the top subjects that kept coming up was the need to re-teach to all the faithful on the importance of the Eucharist and that greater devotion to It be renewed.

Around this same time, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) announced a 3-year Eucharist Revival that would begin over the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus (Corpus Christi, June 19).

Might this be God's providence that the faithful calling out for a renewal of the Eucharist here in the Archdiocese of Saint Paul & Minneapolis happens to be in line with what the USCCB was planning to take place throughout the entire United States? Coincidence...? I think not.

In this Sunday's gospel from Luke, we hear the parable of the Good Samaritan who goes out of his way to care for the man who fell victim to robbers. As Jesus uses this parable to challenge the people around him about who their "neighbor" is, we should also see that as a challenge to us today. Not in the sense that we need to care for those in need, but that as Christians we should understand that the Eucharist is the true medicine people need in their lives.

The Eucharist... the real presence of Jesus in our midst today! That Good Samaritan is Jesus who picks up a person in need of help and brings him to an inn where the innkeeper is called to care for him. The inn is the Church and innkeeper the faithful, us. Jesus continues to call and bring people into his Church so that we can in turn care for them by feeding them with the Word and the Eucharist.

As simple as it may seem to care for those around us, it's actually harder than it appears. I was recently in a conversation with a retired physician and we both agreed that helping heal one's body can be simple enough but it's a much bigger challenge when the soul and mind need healing. Although their body may be physically healthy, they lack energy and life. The mind and soul have been wounded and they find themselves unable to function normally.

Enter Jesus, the Good Samaritan, and his Church. He wants only to restore his loved ones and give them refuge from the sufferings and pains of the world. And we are called to participate in this mission with him.

My dear brothers and sisters, Jesus Christ is truly present among us, especially in the Eucharist. We believe this as Christians, as Catholics. This is why we go to Mass. Are we taking advantage of the reception of this "Food" from heaven and are we in turn helping bring others to Jesus in their need (whether it be joyful or not)?

Please know that Archbishop Hebda will be calling on all the faithful to renew themselves in Apostolic works in the near future, which is in line with what I hope for our own parish family. This means, to be evangelizers. Sharing our experience and love of Jesus with others.
