To make an IRA rollover gift, simply contact your IRA custodian and request that an amount be transferred to Epiphany Parish. Your gift will be put to use today, allowing you to see the difference your donation is making.

KCMR Radio and the VA Clinic in Mason City will be distributing Valentine cards to their patients on Valentine's Day and their home nurses will be surprising their




patients with Valentines that week as well. This is a great way for our community to show our appreciation with Valentine's Day cards.
